There were 292 graduates last year—108 of whom because of the war duties were absent from the College on Commencement Day. In all 1,200 students and members of the Faculty have already responded to the call of their country. Others are rapidly entering the service and leaving positions of trust to be filled by women and men. Hence young women as well as young men are equipping themselves for the responsibilities that have been thrust upon them. The attendance in the Agricultural college last year was approximately 3,500, and the probability is that it

will be as large during the coming year.

At present the summer school is in progress and 500 young men are in training at the College for further efficiency as officers. The Oregon Agricultural College is in the war. President Kerr, the board of regents and the students are doing their utmost to make the college of the greatest possible service to the State and nation at this important time.

### HEAVY EXPRESS BUSINESS.

Rush Shipments Of Fruit And Milk Being Made To Portland.

When asked about the fruit crop, Mr. Smith said he had understood there was quite a large one, which no doubt is the reason that the farmers have hung out the S. O. S. sign for more pickers.

As to the milk conditions in Portland, which is causing these long hauls of the necessary article in every family in the land, it is no doubt caused by the unsettled condition of the milk market in the Metropolis, where there is now pending a strike on the part of producers, coupled with the difficulty with the dealers, who have already raised the price, and threaten another raise.
