Y. M. C. A. IN WAR ZONE

(Continued from Page One)

third of them being practically under shell fire from the enemy. Ninety three huts were destroyed by shell fire from the time Dr. Mott left France until the time he landed in New York, that being the time of the German drive. The Y. M. C. A. has rented a health resort in France and have turned it into a resting place for the men. Every four months the men get seven days leave of absence and that allows them to go to these rest camps. He said they had about 150,000 Chinamen working as laborers on railroads and other places in France. He said there were about 4,000,000 prisoners on both sides all told and that they were able to do quite a little for our boys who were captured by making arrangements with the Danes and Swedes, who are neutral countries. The Y. M. C. A. has promised to send 3,000 men and 800 women by September and 5,000 by Spring.

Soldiers' Welfare Important. Dr. Mott said that we are going to win the war, but what will happen after the war is won is going to be a big question. The 2,000,000 men in Europe hold the destiny of the United States. On their return the business will be taken over by them to a large extent and political offices will be filled by them and from that standpoint nothing is more important than that the morals and health of the men in service should be carefully looked after. He said some people were giving from their incomes or interest on their investments and thought they were doing all that is necessary; but they will have to give from their principal as well before the war is over.

War's Great Dimensions. We are dealing with an enterprise of large dimensions nowadays and did not realize the largeness of it. Never before in the history of the world had there been more than 2,000,000 men at war and now there is more than 50,000,000 combatants and non-combatants on both sides. During a short period in which we have been at war Congress has granted more than it has apportioned in the life of our nation heretofore, and we must command the co-operation of the greatest men we have in our nation and the association is calling for the best men possible. We should make our program so great it would be necessary to call out all, as our times of greatest suffering are the times of greatest creation. He said that he had seen three trains of 40 cars each which were actually dripping with blood carrying the wounded soldiers back from the front.

PATRIOTISM BY PROXY.

It was in the smoking room of a Pullman: "I'm not going to buy four and a quarter per cent bonds when I can lend my money at six per cent, and I'm not going to pay out the difference to the Red Cross either. I'm not going to eat substitutes in my bread. I've sent two boys to the war, and that's enough for one man to sacrifice." "Sacrifice nothing," said one who overheard. "Those boys are 21, and are their own men. The sacrifice is theirs, not yours. You worked them as long as the law would allow and are now trying to capitalize upon their service. If you will not invest a little money made in a free country that your boys may have something to fight with and be cared for when wounded, and if you yourself will not sacrifice even your personal appetite that they may be fed, you are either a pro-German or a tight-wad from Tightville; and in either case you care more for your stomach than for both boys." The incident, which is actual and not fictitious, reminds us of nothing so much as the German farmer who complained of his bad luck in losing both his wife and his best cow "right in the midst of the busy season" adding "and it was a cool cow." SHORT ROADS RELINQUISHED.

Government Wants Only Those That Are Essential. WASHINGTON, July 6.—The Railroad Administration announced tonight that 553 short line railroads have been retained under government control. All employees of these lines will receive the wage awards made to employees of the steam roads and owners will be compensated under the general contract. Control of approximately 1300 short lines, terminal roads and main line feeders finally has been relinquished by the Administration which was given until July 1 by the original railroad control act to turn back to private ownership, roads the operation of which the Government has not regarded as essential.

NEW YORK, July 5.—Three liberty motors supplied the power which drove the first American built Caproni airplane, which received its initial test at Mineola independence day. The machine made 120 miles an hour, greater speed than is attained with Italian motors.

ITALIAN GIRL IN ARMY

Receives Medal for Bravery and Helps Bury Her Brothers.

Mantua in northern Italy has an attractive heroine who served through several campaigns as a soldier in the Italian army. A severe wound received in action led to the discovery of her sex, but not until she had served with distinction through several battles, having received a silver medal for bravery. Two of her brothers were in the Bersagliere Corps, and becoming weary of the ordinary feminine war work, she enlisted and succeeded in passing herself off as a man. When her sex was discovered, she was honorably discharged and today bears the unique distinction of being the only woman who has served in the Bersagliere.
