OREGON'S QUOTA \$45,000,000

Fourth Loan Drive Is To Start On First of October

When the Fourth Liberty Loan is started off about October 1, it will be put over the top in even better time than was the third, says a report from Portland. This was the consensus of opinion of managers of the seven western states who have just finished a conference at San Francisco over methods and difficulties, as reported this morning by State Campaign Manager Robert E. Smith.

Mr. Smith returned today from the conference, stopping a day at his home in Roseburg. He was enthusiastic over the prospect, although he said the probability is that the fourth loan will be for \$8,000,000,000.

"The basis of eight billions is guessed from the quantities of temporary certificates of indebtedness which the government is now issuing and which are being absorbed by the banks," said Mr. Smith. "The campaign committees have been set to the task of inducing the public to take up these certificates as a saving proposition, so that when the real bonds are issued they may be turned in as cash. This will have a double effect of affording an immediate investment at interest and taking some of the burden off the banks."

"At the conference, which lasted two days and two nights, experiences were exchanged on overcoming obstacles that arose during the third drive. I was asked how we handled 'slackers' in Oregon, and I replied that we had none. I told him a wooder Indian could go out and put Oregon over the top because of the spirit of the Oregon people. You can't beat it."

Oregon's quota in the fourth loan drive is \$45,000,000.
