Central Powers in Italy, Austria-Hungary has become increasingly reluctant to continue the war. Rioting has occurred sporadically in Vienna and many other cities, but as yet nothing suggesting a direct revolutionary success has occurred. The Austro-Hungarians unquestionably have become the most war weary of all the peoples in the conflict during the past year. Hungary has pinched them with special severity, largely because of their lack of capacity for organization. Fearful of a collapse in the Hapsburg Empire, the German government has appeased the hunger rioters by sending them food from Germany's own scanty store. This measure, however, can only be temporary. When Germany no longer is able to send grain to Vienna, there will come an intensification of the strain that may compel Austro-Hungary to drop out of the war.

Russia's plight during the fourth year of the war has struck a middle course between the two usual channels of revolution. There has been no such series of excesses that marked the reign of terror during the French Revolution, nor have events followed the orderly precedent of the English revolution. Violence has prevailed among the Russians, but their principal handicap has not been a tendency towards crime. It has been a naive faith in formulas coupled with a childlike lack of education. Nevertheless, the revolution, however faulty, gives fairer hope for the future of Russia than a continuation of the reign of the morally incompetent Romanoffs.

Since the separate peace with the Central Powers was signed by the Bolsheviks, suggestions have been made for a policy of reconnoiter toward Russia on the part of the allies. When advice, however, has prevailed. No scheme of intervention in Russia has been proposed that has seemed feasible and without danger to the cause of democracy.

If democracy's goals are to be attained, the Germans cannot crush them in Russia. The Russians are now in a period of generalized demoralization to restore normal conditions of life. The older democracies of the world should remember the creditable assistance which permitted the Austro-Hungarians to recover their feet from the Italian back to the plain. Since the victory of the

NEW LEASE OF LIFE FOR MOONEY

GOVERNOR STEPHENS STAYS EXECUTION TILL DEC. 13.

Champ Clark Will Be Chairman At Big Meeting in Washington Tomorrow.

LOS ANGELES, July 27.—(By United Press.)—Governor Stephens today granted a stay of execution on Thomas J. Mooney's death sentence for his alleged participation in the Preparedness Parade dynamite outrage in San Francisco until December 13th.

He said it would take all the intervening time to study the case, and he promised that Mooney would have a square deal.

MANY MEETINGS TOMORROW

SAN FRANCISCO, July 27.—(By United Press.)—Speaker Champ Clark, of the House of Representatives, has accepted the chairmanship of the meeting which has been called in Washington Sunday to urge a new trial for Thomas J. Mooney, under sentence of death for murder in connection with a preparedness-day bomb explosion here, according to a telegram received by the International Workers Defense League. Similar meetings are to be held in many other parts of the country.

The First Envelope.

The first envelope of which there is any knowledge included a letter sent in 1806 by Sir William Turnbull to Sir James Oglethorpe. The epistle, with its covering is still preserved in the British museum. At that period, and long afterward, it was the general custom to fold letters and seal them with wax. Early in the last century envelopes began to come into more general use, and stamped envelopes achieved wide popularity in England shortly after the establishment of the penny post in 1840. By 1850 they were largely used on this side of the Atlantic.

It was to Iceland that Christopher Columbus went for information about the new world before starting off on the first of his epoch-making voyages across the Atlantic.

WHAT TO DO NEXT.

Under-Nourished Children Found In Measuring and Weighing Tests.

Thousands of under-nourished children are being found in the national weighing and measuring test which now includes more than five million children. The problem which confronts the communities, which are conducting the test as part of their war service is what to do with these under-nourished children so that they can grow up to be strong, healthy citizens.

Mothers must do the saving; but many of the ill of adult life are now traced to poorly chosen food in childhood. The Children's Bureau of the U. S. Department of Labor believes that there is one sort of worker who above any other is qualified to save the lives of babies, and that is the public health nurse. The Bureau urges that each community which has no such worker make an effort to secure one as its part in the campaign to save children.
