WAR CENSUS OF LA GRANDE

FROM BABIES TO OLD PEOPLE THE NUMBER IS 5,315.

Committee Completed Work In Record Time — Invaluable Guide For Future Activities.

The war census just completed gives the total population of La Grande as 5,315, which includes children from two weeks of age, up to the oldest man or woman in the city.

This census will save duplication of work by different committees, and will show who have given their limit and who might respond more liberally to the various war demands.

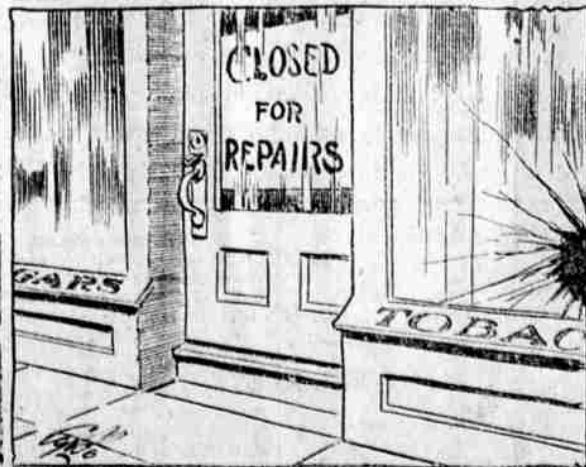
The boys "passed the word" and now no recruit can expect to have good luck unless he has cast his hat upon the receding tide.

M., on the 6th day of August, 1918, for six miles of grading on the Old Oregon Trail between Union and Telocast in Union County. This grading involves approximately 33,000 cu. yds. of excavation of which about 5,000 cu. yds. is solid rock.
