DEATH OF MRS. HARMON

Mother of Seven Children Passes After Long Illness.

Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Harmon, aged 54 years, died at her home in North Spruce St., yesterday. Her death followed a period of illness extending over three years. The deceased leaves a husband, W. T. Harmon, and seven children. The children are: Mrs. Nell Perkins, Mrs. Bertha Lee, Walter, Willis, Cecil, Asia and Anna Harmon, all of La Grande. A sister, Mrs. Anna Dixon, and a brother, Lash Ward are residents of Enterprise.

The family have been residents of La Grande but a few months, and were former residents of Enterprise to which place they arrived from the east three years ago. The remains, accompanied by members of the family were taken to Enterprise today for the funeral and interment.

NEW LAND ENTRY RULES.

Notice has just been received by the local land office that on July 9, 1918, the Secretary of the Interior designated as subject to entry under the act of February 15, 1909, commonly known as the Enlarged Homestead Law, 225,000 acres of land in the State of Oregon. Fully two-thirds of this is within the La Grande District, the balance being in the Burns and Dalles Districts.

Considerable of this land has already been applied for during the past two years and the applications have been suspended pending action on petitions for the designation of the land involved. Designation does not become effective until August 10, 1918.

DRILL ON TONIGHT.

The Oregon Guard, both companies, will meet at the armory this evening at 7:30 o'clock, for the purpose of the usual weekly drill.

Friday evenings of each week the officers and non-commissioned officers will drill, the day having been changed from the first of the week until the latter part, to accommodate the majority of the officers.

SALES OF FARM MACHINERY.

The sales of farm machinery of all kinds is just as heavy this year as it was last year, the only difference being that prices are about 25 per cent higher on all lines, and in spite of the advance in freight rates of 25 per cent.

According to Bolton & Bodmer, the sales are fewer in number, but larger in deliveries to wealthier farmers, or to farming companies or granges.
