

OVER THE NORTHWEST

Marked progress was made during the past week in Hood River, by the crews engaged in constructing the new bridge which will span Hood River, as a part of the Columbia highway.

Arrangements have been made in Salem by Attorney General Brown, Secretary of State Olesott and State Treasurer Kay to make a trip to the latter part of August to Harney and Malheur counties to view Malheur and Malheur lakes, in connection with the application from C. B. McConnell to drain Malheur lake into Harney lake.

The highest lookout station in the United States will be located on the summit of Mount Adams, 12,307 feet above sea level, about August 10, when the standard house, which started on its upward journey more than a year ago will have reached its destination.
