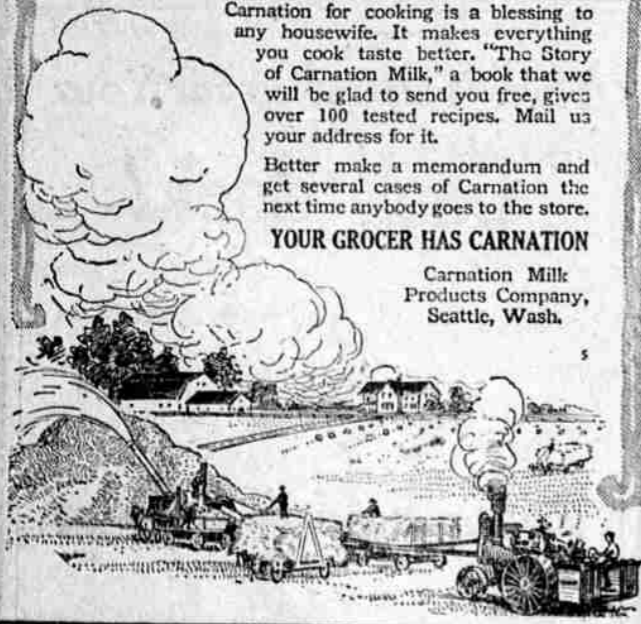

## Save Sugar, Children!

If American children say NO to that lollipop that they used to eat every day, the man who makes the lollipop out of sugar, will tell the man who sells the sugar that he doesn't need so much next time; the man who sells the sugar will tell the man who brings the sugar from other countries in ships, that he doesn't bother to load up so much sugar next trip; the man who brings the sugar from foreign countries will soon find that he doesn't need so many ships, and then he'll say to Uncle Sam, "Here's a ship you DO need, and I don't need."

And Uncle Sam will take that ship, and fill it with wheat, and perhaps some sugar, and one thing and another, and send it over to Europe. With war-ships, and destroyers, to protect it, and the first thing you know, sugar coated buns, made out of American wheat, will be disappearing into the mouths of little French and Belgian refugees.

### ALCOHOL LOSING OUT.

Another "King" Said To Be Tottering On His Throne. NEW YORK, August 6.—Old Demon Rum himself is approaching a condition as anaemic as the near beer substitutes which are trying to replace him, according to statements from no less authoritative a source than the psychopathic ward at Bellevue.

Furthermore, the demon is being choked to death by sales of Liberty Bonds and War Saving Stamps. The undoubted fact that a lot of money which used to go for booze is now spent on war bonds and thrift stamps is one of the reasons advanced by Dr. Stephen P. Jewett, head of Bellevue's famous ward for the woosies, for the marked falling off in the number of alcoholic cases treated there lately.

The high cost of firewater also has its part in lessening the cases of alcoholism, Dr. Jewett thinks. During the six months just passed, Dr. Jewett said yesterday, about 1,079 cases have been treated in the alcoholic ward, as against 3,375 cases treated there throughout the corresponding period of 1917.

Even though a vast number of workers are making more money these days than they ever dreamed of earning before, they are, despite their sudden rise in wealth, also practicing thrift as never before, a commendable condition of affairs, which, Dr. Jewett believes, is largely due to the Liberty Bond and Thrift Stamp habits. The bond and stamp booths get thousands of dollars here that formerly went over

the bars that pave Manhattan with mahogany from the Battery to the Bronx.

Dr. Jewett dwelt upon the significant fact that in recent months very few young men of draft age were treated at Bellevue for alcoholism. Almost all the cases since last winter have been men ranging from 35 to 60 years of age, and a majority of these were cases of chronic alcoholism.

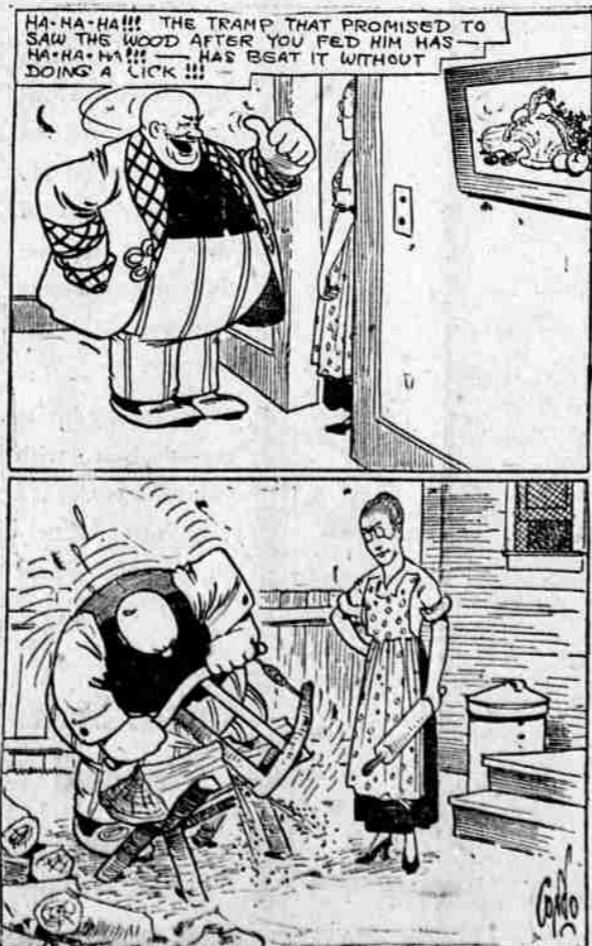
### APPLY POISON SPRAY.

O. A. C. CORVALLIS, August 6.—The new generation of the codling moth is due soon and the poison spray application to apples and pears for the control of the worm should be applied throughout western Oregon immediately for best results. The worms are unusually abundant this year, and great care should be taken to make this application thorough, points out A. L. Lovett, entomologist in the Oregon Agricultural College.
