

SECOND CALL FOR NURSES

ENROLL FOR NURSES IN CIVIL HOSPITALS.

Must Replace Those Who Are Constantly Being Drafted For Service in France.

Doubtless among the large audience that thrilled, through and through at the Tabernacle last evening, stirred to its depths by the intensely patriotic utterances of John K. Kollock, secretary of the State National Council of Defense, who, with a brother now in France, adding the United States to pay its debt to La Fayette, were mothers and sisters of soldiers now in France, or soon to go over seas, who remembered the recent call made by Dr. Anna Howard Shaw, chairman of the Woman's Committee, Council of National Defense and by the Surgeon General of the United States, General W. C. Gorgas, in their call for 25,000 young women, to enroll for training as nurses, to replace in civilian hospitals, those who are constantly being sent to army hospitals "over seas" and if they did give it a second thought, it was determined then and there to enlist.
