

HOME ECONOMICS.

Every housewife should see to it that there is plenty of canned fruit for the coming winter months.

Why? Because—Canning saves the crops. Canning saves transportation. Canning saves labor.

Because—German submarines sank sugar boats. German submarines sank sugar boats.

Our own crop of sugar is smaller than anticipated. Are you a "good provider" Mrs. Housekeeper?

Who says you need sugar for canning? You don't! Save Sugar in Canning. Sugar is not needed as a preservative if fruit is properly sterilized and sealed.

Fruit Juice—Fruit juices can be bottled without sugar and used as fruit drinks, in jelly desserts, pudding sauces, and ice creams.

Directions for making fruit juices: Prepare fruit, cook until soft and strain. Boil the strained juice for five minutes and pour it into jars of glass bottles that have been sterilized by boiling for 15 minutes.

Fruit Leather—Use in place of candy. Concentrate fruit juices by boiling them over direct heat, then by drying them in the top of a double boiler or in a moderate oven.

Leather are also made from unsweetened or slightly sweetened fruit pulp. Peach leather is unsweetened peach marmalade, dried in the oven sprinkled with sugar, rolled and cut.

Dried Fruits—Apples, peaches, cherries, prunes, apricots, the dessert or sweet varieties of pears, black raspberries, purple canes, in some cases blackberries and strawberries may be dried for home use.

Fruits that are dried with the skins on should be dipped by means of a wire basket or a piece of cheese-cloth into a solution of lye made in the proportion of one cupful of concentrated lye to four gallons of water.

Once the drying has been started, it should be carried on continuously to completion, generally with a gradually increasing heat as more and more water is lost.

Dried products must be stored in a dry place to prevent the development of moulds and weevils. They must be carefully protected from flies. Most dried fruits can be stored in glass jars, crocks, or tin boxes, and sealed.

Dried apples may be stored in heavy twilled cotton bags if they are kept in a very dry place.

Drying in the Kitchen Stove. A very slow oven may be used for drying fruits and vegetables spread on papers or on large platters or sheets of metal.

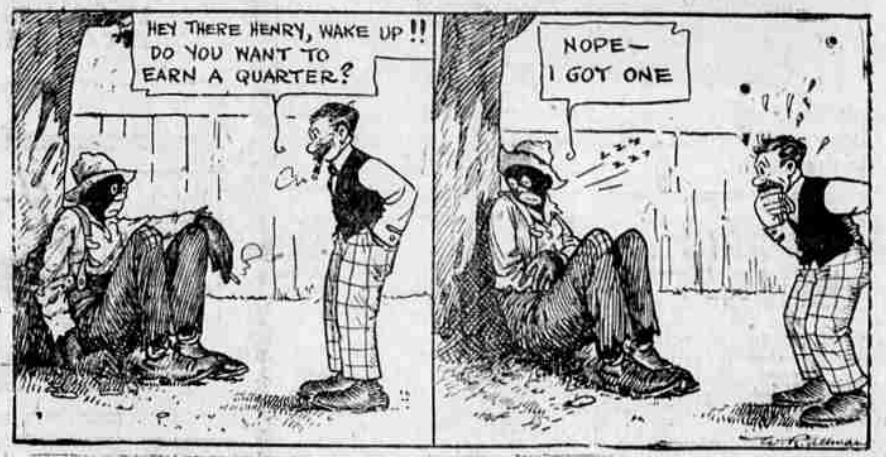
