U. OF O. WOMEN HOPE TO HAVE NEW BUILDING

EUGENE, Ore., Aug. 10.—With the gift of \$500 received last week from Edgar W. Smith of Portland, approximately \$20,000 has been raised for the Women's building fund of the University of Oregon. Mr. Smith is a former student of the university and is now in training for military service at the summer camp on the campus. The State Federation of Women's Clubs will start a campaign for subscriptions to the building fund during the month of September and expects to secure \$100,000. With pledges for this amount, they will go before the legislature with a request for an additional \$100,000, and hope to see the building under way during the coming year.

STATE'S NEEDS ARE MANY

Aggressive Spirit is Necessary to Get Our Own, Says L. J. Simpson. There is an opportunity in state government to link very closely with the plans and movements at Washington, D. C. Appearing before people of the Willamette Valley, recently, L. J. Simpson, candidate for the Republican nomination for Governor, made several statements showing how intimate touch with Washington could advance the interests of Oregon.

"Oregon must be aggressive. It is a vast storehouse of potentialities, which, however, do no one much good until the outside world recognizes them," stated Simpson. "We have a glaring example in the present wooden shipbuilding programme. For some time, men from the Northwest had a terrific fight on their hands to convince the Washington authorities that the timberlands of the South were in no way to be compared with the timber of the Northwest."

"More recently, we find the government's war boards making restrictions in contracts for condensed milk which practically ruin the condenseries of Oregon."

"There are a thousand and one instances where understanding built up between the people at home and the people at Washington, and proper cooperation with our representatives at Washington, wherever they made, will make for recognition of Oregon's position."

"Oregon has been first in everything connected with the war, and it is up to her to see that she is first in everything after the war."

Teaching Staff Now Numbers 20,
With 15 Extension Workers;
500 May Enroll

CORVALLIS, Ore., Aug. 10.—The school of home economics in the Oregon Agricultural College, established 30 years ago with one staff member and 21 students, has grown until at the opening of the school year in September here will be a teaching staff of 25 resident members, 15 extension workers, and a probable enrollment of 500 students.

Miss Mary Van Riper, of New York City, will be a new member of this staff next Fall. She is considered well fitted for the work, having studied in Columbia University, the University of Chicago and the University of California. She was on the home economics staff of the University of Nebraska for four years and is now studying in teachers' college, Columbia University, and teaching classes in dress design in the same institution. She has served as dress designer in some of the best shops in New York City. Miss Hattie Dahlberg, now attending Columbia University, will come to fill the vacancy caused by the leave of absence granted Mrs. Bertha Davis, who will spend the year in study. She received a bachelor's degree from teachers' college, Columbia University, and from the institution was granted in June a higher degree representing much research in home economics education. She has had ten years of teaching experience.
