METHODISTS TO MEET NEXT WEEK

"CENTENNARY DAY" WILL BE OBSERVED ON AUGUST 28.

Prominent Speakers Will Congregate At Milton In Holy Prayer.

MILTON, Ore., August 24.—One of the most interesting features of the Northwest conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church South, which opens here August 27th, will be the "Centenary Day," which will be observed August 28th. Bishop H. M. Du Bose, of California, one of the newly-elected Bishops of the Church, will preside.

Among the speakers who will present the Centenary program will be Rev. O. E. Goddard, of Nashville, Tenn.; Rev. S. A. Neblett, of Cuba; Rev. J. C. Hawk, of China; and Mrs. M. L. Hargrove, of Nashville, Tenn.

Among the subjects to be discussed on "Centenary Day" will be "World Reconstruction after the War," Bishop DuBose will speak on "God's Call to the Church in a World's Crisis." Another address will be delivered on "The Church's Opportunity to Get Out of Its Littleness into Greatness." At night a prominent layman will speak on "Can We Put It Over?" and Rev. S. A. Neblett will present the needs of the mission fields with a stereopticon lecture.

This conference session promises to be one of the most interesting and important in the history of its organization, and while the Centenary movement is already well known to the members of the conference, great interest will be aroused by the coming of these specialists who are highly trained in missionary activities.

The Centenary Movement includes a world program based on a careful survey of need and opportunity, and a vigorous campaign will be made to release the prayer power of the church by enrolling tens of thousands in the "Fellowship of Intercession" and training them as prayer helpers. The Centenary program also includes a "Stewardship Drive" to secure the enrollment of millions of Methodists who will acknowledge their

stewardship by the payment of a tithe.

During the next five years of the Centenary Movement there will be an earnest appeal made for life service, and strenuous efforts will be made to recruit a large number of new workers for the ministry, home and foreign missions, and for service in the local church.

The Southern Methodist Church in this Centenary Movement during the next five years will raise \$25,000,000 to be applied to War Work, Home and Foreign Missions and Church Extension.

WANTS WATER.

SALEM, August 24.—Applications have been filed with State Engineer Lewis by C. B. McConnell of Burns, representing the Harney Basin Development Company, for the appropriation of 166 second feet of water from the Blitzen River and 396 second feet of water from the Silves River for the irrigation of the lands in the bed of Malheur Lake and lands adjoining. These applications are filed in connection with the application submitted some time ago to the State Land Board for the reclamation by drainage of the bed of Malheur Lake.

The project, according to the applications filed, will involve an area of 54,000 acres, a large part of which now lies in the bed of Malheur Lake and must be first drained, and the remainder lies along the border of the lake, which will be irrigated through the construction of canals from the Blitzen and Silves Rivers. The estimated cost of the irrigation features of the project is \$255,000.
