"THE HOUSE OF MIRTH"
Metro Success Is Showing At The Sherry Theater.

The photo version of Edith Wharton's "The House of Mirth," with revelation in acting, it was one of the most worth-while productions ever reviewed by the writer and is worthy the highest tribute that can be paid in words.

The play stands out as something distinctive and unusual, and both the direction and photography demands the highest praise. The picture was taken from the famous novel of the same name and written by the noted author, Edith Wharton, and was adapted for the screen by June Mathis and Albert Capellani. It is the story of a young girl, Lily Bart, played by Katherine Harris Barrymore, who has been reared in luxury and then left penniless by her parents in the care of a wealthy aunt.

The girl develops a recklessness which astonishes her relative and during a stormy scene she is told that she must marry the richest man of her acquaintance. The story shows her careful campaign in her marriage schemes but her debts drive her to gambling in cards and stocks and places her at the mercy of an unprincipled society reprobate who turns her into scandal and divorce. Her society career is ruined and she faces bankruptcy. She is retrieved, however, by the young lawyer, with whom she was in love before her thoughtless ambitions led her to cast him off. This love life is out of the social quarters into which she has fallen and she again sees life through happy eyes.

The play is so magnificently acted that it was like attending an opening night performance on Broadway. Henry Kolker is seen as the young lawyer, Lawrence Sheldon and Joseph Kilgour as the society scoundrel, Augustus P. Dorset. Christine Mayo also a wonderful characterization of the wife, Bertha Trevelyan-Dorset, who counts the admiration of every man she meets, while other important parts are played by Lottie Briscoe, Edward Abelen, Pauline Wadsworth, Maggie Western, Nellie Parker, Spaulding, W. D. Fichter, Sonja

Brey, Kempton Greene and Morris Jones.
