CLOTHING FOR THE BELGIANS

RED CROSS WILL TAKE CONTRIBUTIONS SEPT. 23-30.

Local Chapter And Branches Are To Supply A Quota Of Five Tons.

A drive for clothing for the Belgian people is to be conducted from September 23 to 30 and this movement is entrusted to the American Red Cross.

Every kind of garment, for all ages and both sexes, is urgently needed. In addition, piece goods—light, warm cotton flannel and other kinds of cloth from which to make garments for new born babies, tickings, sheeting and blankets, woolen goods of any kind—

and shoes of every size are asked for. Scrap leather is needed for repairing footwear.

Garments need not be in perfect condition. A hundred thousand dollars worth of the occupied regions, are being worn in a small livelihood by repairing gift clothing and making new garments adapted to needs with which they are familiar.

GARMENTS NEEDED. (This list is merely suggestive.)

CUBA GIVES TO AID THE ALLIED VICTIMS

"TREASURE ISLAND."

"Treasure Island" the most famous work of Robert Louis Stevenson, was selected by William Fox for the delight of men and women and the boys and girls of America, largely because it has so many close associations with America itself.

In the first place, the story was originally written merely to amuse an American youngster, Mr. Stevenson's stepson, whose early years had been spent in California.

The sources of several incidents in the story have been admitted by Stevenson himself to have been taken from American writers. The use of a skeleton to point the position of buried treasure came from Edgar Allan Poe.

"It is my debt to Washington Irving," says the author of "Treasure Island," "that exercises my conscience, and justly so, for I have been plagiarized was rarely carried farther. I chanced to pick up the 'Tales of a Traveller' some time ago, and to show in an anthology of great writers, and the book flew up and struck me: Billy Bonny and the company in the part of the whole inner spirit and a good deal of the material detail of the first chapters—all were there, all were the property of Washington Irving."

In the novel itself, references to America are frequent. The notorious Flint died in Savannah when that city was only 21 years old. And the last heard of "Long John Silver" was somewhere on the coast of Spanish America.

"Treasure Island" was published as a book in the end of November, 1883, and with it came Stevenson's first popular success. Its reception reads like a fairy tale. Statesmen and judges and all sorts of staid and sober men became boys once more, sitting up long after bedtime to read this new book.

"When Treasure Island" appeared first, in the winter of 1883-82, as a serial in "Young Folks," it bore the name of "Captain George North." Such was the pen name which Stevenson was using at the time.

In 1883, when the story was first published in book form, the author received \$500 for the rights to it. During the ensuing years, however, about \$9,500 were paid to him in royalties. This, to a man who has written a 1917 "best seller," is a mere bagatelle. In 1882 it was almost a fortune.
