LA GRANDE MAN TO LEAVE FOR SERVICE OF COUNTRY EXPRESSES IDEAL SPIRIT

Colonel Leader had finished his all too short address at the luncheon tendered him by prominent citizens of La Grande. He had told his audience that the old British bulldog nation had fought so hard during the past four years that now he was tired and needed help, and had called upon his grown-up child, the youthful American nation to come to his aid, and the response had been a few millions of clean-blooded, disciplined young men had gone to Europe to help make the world a safe place to live in.
