

HOT LAKE'S QUOTA IS ALREADY SUBSCRIBED

**COL. LEADER MEETS FORMER
COMPANION AT THE SANA-
TARIUM—HOT LAKE ENJOY-
ING INCREASED PATRONAGE—
HARVEST NEARLY ENDED.**

HOT LAKE, Sept. 19.—(Special.)—Yesterday Dr. Phy. Mark Phy and Charley King drove over to La Grande to attend the luncheon given Colonel Leader. It was a happy meeting for the latter named, who with the gallant colonel held a few minutes' reminiscence conversation over the time they were both in the Boer War in South Africa. Colonel Leader wears the ribbon of the campaign medal, such as one of the two decorations which Charles King had bestowed upon him by Queen Victoria and Queen Alexandra. In the afternoon, Colonel Leader was driven over to Hot Lake by Pat Foley and Norman Desilet, and enjoyed a well earned bath and rest after his long auto journey in the morning from Enterprise.

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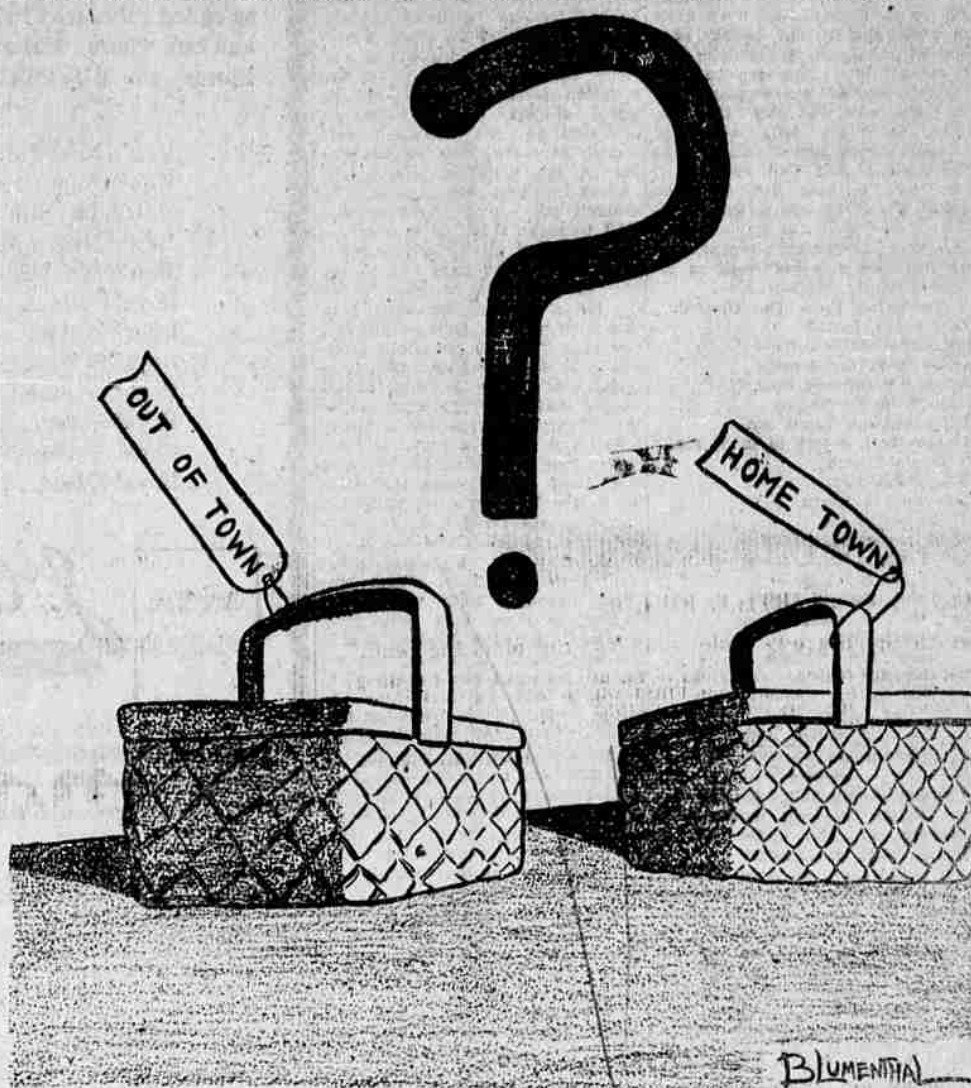
