CAMPAIGN TO CLOSE TOMORROW

and with the railroad subscriptions, which, it has lately been learned, railroad centers are to receive credit for—much over-subscribed, Mr. Hyatt has as yet received no detailed report from either Mr. Haller or Mr. Barber, but no special difficulty in collecting ratings has been encountered.

E. E. Kiddle, chairman of the Island City district, reports about \$51,350 of the \$33,875 due from that district, as raised. The main work of the campaign is over there, however, and a few minor subscriptions are now being taken in.

In commenting on the work in his district, Mr. Kiddle said this morning, "There are a few in the district who have the ability to subscribe and will not, but in the main the people have subscribed very freely. These cases have been referred to the emergency committee and will be handled accordingly."

"In addition, I must say that credit for the work of this campaign is due first and last to the ladies. There hasn't been a man in the field."

The Perry district, of which Earl Stoddard is chairman, reports the quota of \$14,000 as raised. The proportion subscribed by Perry and Palmer Junction, which are combined into the Perry district, is about four to seven. Mr. Stoddard reports no special difficulty in collecting the money. In general, it may be said, according to his statements, the desire to under-subscribe is due to misinformation.

J. W. Scott, of Higgard, makes the exceptional report of a campaign without a single slacker. All have subscribed readily. \$1,800 has been subscribed already. The entire quota of \$2,750 will be ready to deposit at the central office here by tomorrow evening, according to present indications.
