TAXES COMING IN.

Payments Speed Up On Account Of Approaching Delinquency.

The sheriff's office reports that tax money is coming in quite rapidly at present on account of the short time that now intervenes when the unpaid taxes will become delinquent. On account of the rush at the courthouse, there is no accurate statement available as to the amount of tax that has been received in the past few days, but the payments have speeded up very appreciably.

Only two days are left in which to pay the second half of the current tax. After October 5, all taxes remaining unpaid will be delinquent and subject to an interest charge of 1 per cent per month. After November 4, a further penalty of 5 per cent will be added.

RAILROAD MEN BUY HEAVILY

GREAT PATRIOTISM AND LOYALTY MANIFESTED.

Work Moves On Rapidly And In Entire Accord With The Object Sought.

The quota assigned to this "railroad division" will probably be reached within a few days by voluntary subscriptions, conforming to the rate card, according to information received. Probably no speaker has yet so completely expressed the principles upon which the campaign is being conducted among railroad employees as A. W. Robbins, general attorney for the O. W. R. & N. yesterday afternoon in a fifteen minute talk on "The Advantages of Buying A Liberty Bond."

The essence of Mr. Robbins' address embodied in his assertion that heavy sacrifices will be necessary through our common hatred of Prussianism and all its attendant evils. Mr. Robbins appealed chiefly to the patriotism of his hearers, but reminded them of the sound business policy of investing their savings in this form of security.

"Germany has sneaked upon a trusting world with this war," said Mr. Robbins. Continuing, he said: "At the opening of the war she was indeed strong and she is still strong... she had been preparing since the partition of Alsace-Lorraine about forty years ago. The allied powers have only slowly been reinforcing themselves."

Mr. Robbins incidentally scored the term "German efficiency," and the advice was given to speak hereafter of American efficiency. Cooperation has been the means of accomplishing the wonderful progress in armaments and war development of this country in the past year and a half.

Mr. Robbins emphasized the fallacy of the expectation of an early end of the war. Though Bulgaria has laid down arms and the situation on all fronts is at present comparatively favorable, yet the gravest difficulties of conquering Germany will not be experienced until the interior has been reached. Mr. Robbins substantiated his statement that progress there will be very slow by the opinions of a number of well-known military authorities.

The audience was reminded of the sound business policy of investing savings in this form of security. No sacrifice here, said Mr. Robbins, can be as great as that of the Americans across the water. While we suffer temporary inconvenience by loaning our money, these soldiers are at an average monthly loss of about \$100, aside from personal sacrifices. We should do our utmost to ameliorate the condition of those who are living in mud and bathing in blood that a great ideal may live. This is a war for ideals. For that reason every person ready to subscribe to the cause for which we are striving is as deeply obligated personally as the men in the trenches. They will not stop when they feel that victory is assured. It is likewise our duty to continue to give until victory is certainly gained."

MONKS MAKE GOOD IN ALLIED ARMIES

ROME, Aug. 15.—(By Mail).—Out of a world-wide membership of 9,262, a total of 1,976 Capuchin monks are now serving in the allied armies in Italy, France, England and Belgium.

The order of the Capuchin monks which is a branch of the famous Franciscan Brotherhood, and whose members are known all over the world, has just completed its statistics for the first half of the present year.

Aside from showing the unusual bareheaded, barefooted brown-robed large percentage of monks now serving under arms, figures reveal a condition in the Capuchin Brotherhood that is unquestionably to be found in all the other monastic orders, namely, that the war has practically put an end to the entrance of new members.

Members of the various brotherhoods of monks come almost exclusively from the ranks of ardent young men. As all young men in the allied countries for four years past have now entered the army the moment they were of age, there have been practically no novices received into the monasteries.

Whether this condition will continue after the war and result in gradual diminution if not disappearance of the religious brotherhoods remains to be seen.

Novices Are Scarce. Capuchins in the Province of Paris for 1917 had only two novices, while the provinces of Lyons and Toulon counted only eight novices, clerks and converts each for the entire year. The same condition exists in Italy, and in the provinces of Rome and Parma there was not a single novice for 1917.

On the other hand, Capuchin monks who have been called to the colors in the varied allied countries have been covering themselves and their brotherhood with glory. They have demonstrated that they can fight as valiantly as they formerly prayed and strove for the conversion of members both to the church and to their brotherhood.

In Italy the number of Capuchin monks mobilized is 1,558, besides 122 who are serving as military chaplains, and 94 who are serving as chaplains in the Red Cross. Of the entire number that have served or are serving in the Italian army 48 have been killed, 24 wounded, 69 made prisoners and 14 have disappeared. Altogether, 22 have been decorated with the Italian medal for valor on the field of battle.

In France there are 20 Capuchin monks who have reached the full grade of officer, while 239 others are serving as under-officers or privates. Thirty-seven have been killed in France and 42 wounded.

One hundred and one of these brothers in France have received a total of 162 citations for bravery and heroism, eight have been awarded the coveted Medaille Militaire, 99 have been decorated with the Croix de Guerre, two have received the supreme distinction of the Legion of Honor, while many others have received the French Medaille des Epitaphes, besides Serbian, Belgian and Russian decorations. Eighty-five have received promotions in the French armies.

Good Belgian Record. Of the 48 Capuchins mobilized in Belgium, where the members

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of these religious orders are not required to serve as combatants, 18 are serving as army chaplains, 23 as stretcher bearers, and seven in other departments. There has been one monk killed with the Belgian army, three wounded, and one disappeared, presumably a prisoner. Of the entire 48, ten have been killed in the order of the day before the Belgian army, one decorated with the Order of Leopold, one with the French Legion of Honor, three with the Croix de Guerre and two with the Medaille Militaire.

In addition, two other Capuchin monks, for the allied propaganda which they have conducted in De Belgische Standard have been decorated by the French government with the palms of Officers of the French Academy.

In the English army there are regularly enrolled 16 Capuchins as army chaplains and five as stretcher bearers, of whom one has been wounded.

Among the Irish Capuchins, four are serving as chaplains, one of whom has been decorated with the English Military Cross.

In addition to all these, 40 other Capuchin missionaries of Belgian, French and Italian nationality are serving as chaplains with the English troops in India.

RETURN FROM CAMP LEWIS

"If only everyone could see the work being done at Camp Lewis and could see the troops as they depart for France, they surely would not grudge making almost any sacrifice toward the various war activities. While we live here in comparative comfort, enjoying ourselves there is real tragedy there. Mrs. Pike states that five died from pneumonia and Spanish influenza at Camp Lewis on Friday.

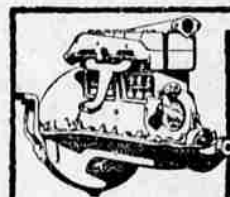
