NATION IS NOT FOR GERMAN-MADE PEACE

official copies added little or nothing to his information.

In explaining the necessity for carefully considered action at this time, officials point out that the conditions arising from the presentation of separate and formal communications from the two great central powers are quite different from those under which Count Burian's adroit proposal to hold secret and "non-binding" conferences was so summarily dealt with.

Now the proposition is for formal and open discussions in a manner to bind the principals, with hostilities suspended in the meantime. Therefore, the fact is recognized that the people of America and of the entente countries who are really desirous of peace on fair terms are entitled to an explanation of the reasons which move the government in rejecting a proposal which on its face might appear to bear evidence of sincerity.

Rid World of Militarism. They must understand, these officials say, the impossibility of compliance with these requests without sacrifice of all the safeguards which are regarded as essential to the conclusion of the kind of peace which America and the allies are determined to have and for which so many lives already have been given; one that shall rid the world of German military domination and insure it against another and even more savage war as soon as the German war lords can repair their shattered armies and rehabilitate their strained and broken financial and economic conditions.

It was emphasized that the idea must not get out that America does not desire peace, for the war is being waged for the realization of certain high ideals of democracy and liberty and not for revenge or desire to destroy any nation.

Another consideration which has influenced the officials who are shaping the course of these negotiations, is the probable effect upon the German people themselves of a curt, sharp and unreasoned refusal of their appeal. They have been told by their rulers that the purpose of their energies was the destruction of Germany and Austria.

Now the people of Germany and Austria are finding out that they are in no danger of extermination if they cast off their armies and stop fighting. Work to this end has been done by the system of propaganda in the enemy countries by entente and the American agencies. Germany and Austria have been showered with leaflets and pamphlets printed in their own languages and in defiance of the threats of terrible punishment for doing so, the people have read for themselves clear statements of the reasons which influence America and entente Europe to prosecute the war to complete victory.

So these people are being taken into account in dealing with the German and Austrian appeals, and the replies which will be made must let them understand that it is only because these appeals do not hold out promise of a real peace on reasonable terms that they are rejected.

Ever since Count Burian's preceding proposal was rejected it has been realized that the step now taken by the Teutonic governments might be expected at any time. Therefore there has been ample opportunity for discussion of the course to be followed and the present exchanges between President Wilson and the entente chancelleries, probably will not be prolonged. Every possible phase of the situation is said to have been given attention, even such a development as an appeal from French Socialists for full consideration of the German offer.

Other Offers to Come. That rejection of the present propositions will be followed by other offers is not doubted in Washington. Determined to save their countries from invasions, the Austrian and German emperors are believed to be certain to come forward very shortly with more liberal concessions.

In fact the unanimous view here is that if the entente and American armies are firmly supported by their peoples and continue the war at the same tremendously aggressive pace maintained since the turn of the tide at Chateau Thierry, the time is not far off when the central powers will be ready actually to accept dictated terms.

It was said at the Spanish embassy Monday night that the appeal to President Wilson for peace from Turkey which the German propaganda service at Berlin had announced was coming through Spain had not been received. It is assumed that any proposal from Turkey would follow the form of those from Germany and Austria.

THRESHING IS DELAYED

RAINS INTERFERE WITH WORK OF HARVESTERS.

Reports On Output Have Come Promptly, Says County Agent Spillman.

Threshermen and combine owners have been reporting the amount of grain threshed, and for whom it is threshed as required by provisions contained in Section 22 of Act of Congress "Public No. 49, 65th Congress," approved August 19, 1917. This provides that the threshermen or combine owners, whether threshing for themselves or for the public, send in a report each month as to the amount of grain threshed that month. If at the end of the month, he has not completed threshing for himself or others, he is not required to report until he has completed his threshing on that particular farm. However, the threshing that is completed on any one farm within a given month must be reported at the end of the month.

As a rule threshermen have been reporting quite satisfactorily, and according to Mr. Spillman have all shown a willingness to co-operate to the best of their ability.

The occasional rains during the month of September have delayed the threshing operations somewhat as well as scarcity of help, which, together make a larger per cent of threshing run over to the month of October than ordinarily. However, practically all the grain will be threshed during the month of October unless some unforeseen condition arises, and a practically complete report should be turned in by the end of that month. To date, 494,218 bushels of wheat have been reported as threshed in the county.
