### EGGS GO TO 60; BUTTER IS UP

#### ALL FOODSTUFFS SHOW STEEP RISE IN MARKETS.

Fair Price Committee Issues Official Price Lists For Public Reference.

With the cold, frosty mornings upon us and the crisp fall air proclaiming the hen's vacation period eggs have shot up to 60 cents a dozen, or 5 cents apiece. Your ham and eggs now means money, so eat them sparingly and chew them well, says Federal Food Administrator W. B. Ayer, and the same sentiment is voiced by County Food Administrator T. J. Scroggin. The Fair Price Committee of the local food organization has issued the following price list, which contains prices dealers should charge the public for foodstuffs:

- Fresh Eggs—Retailer pays 55c, consumer pays 60c.
- Butter, fresh creamery—retailer pays 63c, consumer pays 69c.
- Potatoes, New—Retailer pays 2c, consumer pays 2 1/2c.
- Full Cream Cheese—Retailer pays 32c, consumer 40c.
- Fresh Salmon—Retailer pays 22c, consumer pays 30c.
- Corn Meal, yellow, bulk, 100 lbs.—Retailer pays 5 1/2c, consumer 7 1/2c.
- Corn Meal, white, bulk, 100 lbs.—Retailer pays 6 1-10c, consumer pays 8c.
- Corn meal, yellow, 10 lb. bag, bale—Retailer pays 6 3/4c, consumer pays 8c.
- Corn meal, white, 10-lb. bag, bale—Retailer pays 6 3/4c, consumer pays 8c.
- Roller Oats, 90-lb. bags, bbl.—Retailer pays 7 1/2c, consumer 9c.
- Roller Oats, 9-lb. bags, bale—Retailer pays 7 1/2c, consumer 9c.
