wrong and I undertake as far as possible to pay for it. Prince Maximilian's standpoint still seems essentially different from what is vital to us. Germany has undergone no other change of outlook nor change of heart, which alone can permit world peace to be permanent."

"Perhaps the most welcome feature Germany must say outright: 'I did care of Germany's hastily arranged move is that it can be only a measure of her military necessity,'" says the Times.

**Ambiguous And Ingenious.**  
After reviewing the chancellor's speech the Times declares it to be "ambiguous and disingenuous stuff," and asks:

"Will Germany ever realize that there is only one way for her, namely, by deeds and not words? It is far too late to talk of a basis for peace negotiations. The determination of the allied peoples is that the defeat of those who made war shall be complete, and absolute. That task they have undertaken, and it shall be performed to the very end and there shall be no peace until Germany has surrendered without condition to terms which will leave her not merely without a will, but without the power to break it."

### GERMANY FEARS DANGER

MADRID, Oct. 8.—The Diario Universal, the organ of Count Romanones, minister of justice, sees in the German peace proposal the proof of the superiority and efficacy of democratic principles. It says:

"Finding itself in a grave situation the German government turns toward the left in the presence of danger. It does not appeal to force, but seeks salvation in the abandonment of the aristocratic, militaristic organization which is Germany's principal characteristic."

Foreign Minister Dato's newspaper, the Epoca, says:

"It is not peace, because the central powers will not admit President Wilson's conditions without modification, but in any case one step in it a move toward peace, interesting alike to belligerents and neutrals."

### AUSTRIA STRONG FOR PEACE.

AMSTERDAM, Oct. 8.—Dispatches from Vienna show Austrian newspapers to be deeply impressed with the peace move made by the central powers, and filled with hope for its success.

The Freudenblatt has some doubts, saying: "We must reckon with everything and must be armed for all events."

"Never before was it necessary to look forward to coming events with such determination," says the Neue Freie Presse. "It is not military necessity which forces the monarchy to make such concessions."

### FRANCE SEES NOTHING IN IT.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 8.—Comment of the French press on the Teutonic peace proposals is summarized in an official dispatch from France Monday, as follows:

"The step taken by Germany, Austria-Hungary and Turkey is a collective confession of the extremely serious situation they are now in owing to the allied victory. A month ago Berlin would not have consented to carry so far her peace maneuvers. But this step maintains the confused character that all German proposals have borne. This one evidently shows the inward thought that it might succeed in weakening the allied peoples' will or setting her enemies against each other. She will see that she is mistaken."

"The proposals do not mention acceptance of the 8th of January message 14 points, but only say the

### Signers of the Declaration.

The American Declaration of Independence was signed by every member of the continental congress that made it. There were three signers from New Hampshire, five from Massachusetts, two from Rhode Island, four from Connecticut, four from New York, five from New Jersey, three from Delaware, nine from Pennsylvania, four from Maryland, seven from Virginia, three from North Carolina, four from South Carolina and three from Georgia.

### Water Hyacinth Has Value.

The water hyacinth, which so rapidly fills up certain streams, is found to have a high value as a fertilizer. On account of the large amount of water the green plant contains the material is partially dried before slacking and after becoming well rotted it proves to have about the same composition as farmyard manure, except that it is richer in potash.

The papers note that the declaration made yesterday at the Reichstag by Prince Maximilian of Baden are in some essential points in contradiction of the 14 clear clauses of President Wilson's message.

### GERMANY'S NEW MOVE.

BASEL, Switzerland, Oct. 8.—Herr Friedberg, vice president of the Prussian ministry of state, will be a member of what is designated as a limited government committee in Berlin, according to the Vossische Zeitung. The committee, it states, will otherwise comprise the chancellor, the vice chancellor and Herr Scheidemann and Herr Groeber, secretaries of state without portfolio.

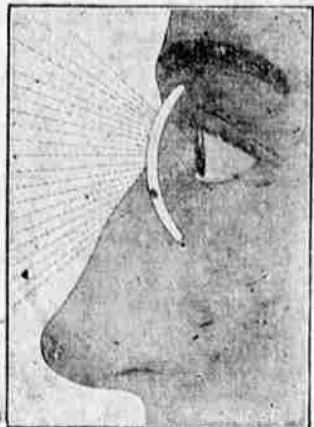
