MRS. GOODHUE QUILTS

Mrs. Jessie Talbot Named as Red Cross Secretary.

Owing to possibility of being called to Wisconsin at any moment to the bedside of sick relatives, Mrs. Jessie Goodhue today resigned as secretary of the Red Cross chapter and Mrs. Jessie Talbot was appointed to fill that position. It is expected that the secretary's office will be located where the Red Cross work is being done and Mrs. Talbot will devote her whole time to the work. The secretary's office will be in constant operation and information can always be had there regarding Red Cross work.

Mrs. Rosenbaum, superintendent of work, has requested that all ladies having yarn and garments in their possession, to please return same at an early date to the Red Cross rooms. She also requests the use of five more sewing machines to accommodate the increasing work and the number of workers who are now giving regular hours to the service.

The Tillamook, Fairview and Blaine Red Cross organizations joined in a mass gathering picnic and succeeded in bringing in more than 1000 sacks of sphagnum moss.

LOCAL INSTITUTION WINS COMMENDATION

Miss Elizabeth Darling, president of the State board of registration and enumeration of nurses, left yesterday afternoon for Baker after inspecting the Grande Ronde hospital and training school for nurses here yesterday.

Miss Darling stated that the Grande Ronde Hospital has the distinction of conducting the only recognized school for nurses in Union and Walla Walla counties. This means that graduates of this school will be able to take the State examination for nurses and upon passing this are eligible to registration under the state law.

Miss Darling further expressed her pleasure in finding the up-to-date institution and the creditable work being done in a town of this size.

On account of abnormal conditions of the war, the State Board has changed the age at which training as a nurse may be begun under the state law from 20 to 19 years.
