## OLSON ASKS FOR ELECTION

APPOINTEE OF GOV. WITHEY-COMBE WILL RUN.

Name Must Be Written On Ballot By Republicans Of State.

Justice Conrad P. Olson, of the Supreme Court of Oregon, has announced his candidacy for election by the voters in November to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Justice Frank K. Moore.

Justice Olson was appointed by Governor Withycombe September 28th, and he immediately assumed the duties of the office.

"I shall make no personal canvass for the position of Justice of the Supreme Court to be voted in the November election by writing in names," said Justice Olson today. "I took this position at the hands of the Governor with the idea of performing the work that goes with the position, resigned my senatorship and am willing to leave the result to the voters of the State without a personal campaign.

"My ideals shall be to thoroughly go into every case before me to the end that a square deal be given to the litigants, and to expedite as much as possible the decision of cases to the end that delays may not defeat justice."

Justice Conrad P. Olson was born in Wisconsin of pioneer parents. He was educated at Stevens Point Normal and the University of Wisconsin, obtaining his law degree at the latter place. Served on the Wisconsin State Civil Service Commission as examiner, and was principal of schools.

Located in Portland, Oregon, and opened up law offices, and at the time of his appointment had a good standing before the bar. Has served in both houses of the Legislature every session beginning with 1913, taking a very active part. Was generally considered the probable president of the Senate at the coming election.

In 1917 was tendered the appointment to the Circuit Court Bench of Multnomah County, but declined the same. Has always taken a very active part in all civic and public activities and since the war started has been a four-minute man, solicitor and speaker on all the Liberty Loans and other war drives. He did not claim exemption by reason of holding a state office.

Owing to a defect in the election laws no method is provided of getting a name on the ballot when a vacancy occurs within 40 days before the election, as in this case, and so it will be necessary for the voters to write in the name of their choice in a space provided.

It seems generally conceded that, having been selected by the Governor for the position of Supreme Court Justice and being actually engaged in the work, that Justice Olson will be elected even though there will be other candidates in the field.

## "GUILTY," SAYS JURY

First Of Liquor Cases Is Decided In District Court.

After a two days' trial on the charge of selling intoxicating liquors contrary to the state law, the jury last evening brought in a verdict of guilty as charged in the case of State vs. Adolph Newlin. This is the first of two cases against Mr. Newlin, each case being based on similar evidence. The court will pass sentence Monday.

## PRO-GERMAN IS UNDER ARREST

Refuses To Subscribe To Liberty Bonds—Alleges Him Sympathies

William E. Peterson, railroad employe of Tolocant, was arrested yesterday by Sheriff Warnick for pro-German utterances in refusing to subscribe in the Liberty Loan campaign. Although receiving \$133 per month and without dependents, he persistently refused to recognize his duty and evidenced decidedly anti-American sympathies. The prisoner, who is a native of Denmark, is being held here pending action of the United States courts at Portland.

## 22-RIFLE KILLS WALLOWA CHILD

LITTLE "PETE" McCLAREN DIES INSTANTLY.

Two Youngsters Were Playing With Gun — Did Not Know It Was Loaded.

WALLOWA, Or., Oct. 11.—(Special.)—As a result of two little chaps playing with a 22-rifle which they did not know was loaded, little Kenneth "Pete" McClaren, aged about six years, lies at the home of his parents dead.

The accident occurred yesterday, when Tom Baker, aged about 12 years and "Pete" McClaren entered the toilet in the Brown house and found a 22 rifle standing in the corner. Little "Pete" in childish curiosity, asked Tom to make it explode and the two took the gun down and laid it across a chair. The McClaren child was in front of the muzzle of the gun when it exploded and the bullet, passing through his little body, killed him instantly.

Mr. and Mrs. C. A. McClaren, parents of the little one, are grief-stricken over the horrible accident and the whole community shares in the sorrow. The Baker boy is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Baker.
