

OREGON MEN GO EAST.

EUGENE, Oct. 18.—Four more members of the Oregon training camps for officers have just received calls to report at Army camps and central officers' training schools. The latest called are George H. Curry, of Vale, Sergeant-Major of the camp; James T. Schuyler, of Portland; George Black, of Portland, and Claude H. Giles, of Coquille.

Curry was ordered to report to Camp Pike, Ark., Infantry Officers' Training School. Schuyler has received a commission as a Captain of engineers and will go to Fort Douglas, Utah. Giles goes to the Artillery Officers' Training School at Camp Zachary Taylor, Louisville, Ky. Black received a double call, one for Camp Taylor and the other for the aviation school at Berkeley Cal. He chose the air service.

NO GASOLINE FOR SALE SUNDAY

New War Measure By Oregon State Council of Defense.

The Oregon State Council of Defense has requested that no delivery of gasoline, engine distillate or other petroleum products be made on Sunday, and as a result the Standard Oil Company has announced that beginning Sunday, October 20, and thereafter until further notice, all of their distributing stations in the State of Oregon, including their automobile service stations, will be closed on Sunday. No sale or delivery of any kind will be made on that day.

As in the case of the recent announcement regarding the sale of gasoline and engine distillate on weekdays only between the hours of 6:00 a. m. and 6:00 p. m., this latest request by the State Council of Defense is made for the purpose of conserving man-power. It is expected that all users of petroleum products will patriotically co-operate in making this important new war measure effective.

LAW MAY BE REVISED.

Portland.—The Industrial Welfare Commission this week appointed a special committee, representing the public, employers and employees, to consider the question of whether women shall be employed in mercantile establishments after 6 o'clock in the evening. The committee was appointed in response to a petition from the anti-Blue Law League. The petition, which originated with cigar merchants of the city, alleges that business is suffering because enough men for work after 6 o'clock cannot be obtained.

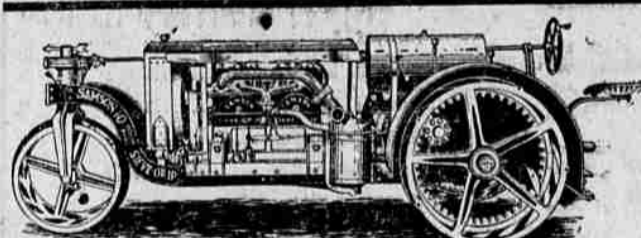
