A large shipment of cartons to carry Christmas presents to the boys overseas has been received by the Red Cross and Mrs. Frank Rohan, who is in charge of this department, asks that all relatives who contemplate using the cartons immediately secure information necessary.

Her offices in Foley Hotel building will be open every day from 9:30 to 12 o'clock and from 1 to 5 o'clock. The office is in the room formerly occupied by Gates' Tail Suits.

## LEAGUE MANAGER IS HELD IN PRISON

LEWISTON, Idaho, Oct. 21.—The hearing in the case of Carl H. Davis, Non-Partisan League manager for north Idaho, on the charge of making seditious utterance was called Saturday afternoon before United States Commissioner E. O. Neill. Davis waived examination and his bond was fixed at \$7500 for appearance before the federal court at Moscow for trial. He did not provide bond and was returned to the county jail.

L. F. Parson, chairman of the Latah County Council of Defense, who made the complaint against Davis, was present at the hearing with witnesses for the government.
