Sumpter Railroad Case Heard

Salem—Following the filing of affidavit by the Baker County White Pine Lumber company, in which it was stated that the Sumpter Valley Railroad is charging the 25 per cent increase in freight rates when such increase is not sanctioned by the public service commission, the case is being heard in circuit court here. It is said that the railroad company is making an effort to get back under Federal control and that in the meantime it ignored the authority of the commission.

Telephone Companies May Consolidate
Portland—The consolidation of the Home and Bell telephone companies is being urged as a remedy for the poor service caused by insufficient labor. It is claimed that the automatic system which may be installed upon consolidation, will in large part solve the problem.

Cancels Physical Examinations
Portland—Local draft board No. 3 has canceled all physical examinations until further notice. This follows the recommendation of city health officials.

Furniture Patterns Curtained
Portland—Following the ruling of the war industries board, local furniture manufacturers will make no furniture on new patterns and will curtail all present patterns 50 per cent. It is claimed that the output may be larger under this provision.

Water Supply for Prineville, Prineville, Ore: A water supply which will furnish double the amount now given, will be afforded the city upon the completion of the large storage water tank now under construction by the Deschutes Power Company. It will be a stave tank, with a diameter of 24 feet and height of 55 feet, and will be placed upon concrete piers. It will have a capacity of 155,000 gallons, which is more than double the supply now furnished. This will give ample water for domestic use and irrigation purposes, and will afford double protection in case of fire.
