Concerning Patents.

Express Rate Increase Opposed

Salem, Oct. 28.—The Oregon public service commission is preparing to request the Washington and Idaho commissions to join with it in filing a complaint with the interstate commerce commission against the latest 10 per cent increase in express rates, which was announced Sunday.

Chairman Miller of the Oregon commission pointed out that the percentage increase works a heavy discrimination against the west, where distances are long and rates are correspondingly high. The same as did the percentage increase in freight rates. This is the record 10 per cent increase which has been made in express rates.

John Day Road Approved

Salem, Oct. 28.—The state highway department today received notice that the United States department of agriculture has approved the proposed post road project for the improvement of the John Day highway, running out from Prairie City, Grant county. The road is now being used extensively for hauling chrome ore. The proposed project covers 7.4 miles, which will be graded and gravelled at an estimate cost of \$150,000, of which the state will pay half and the government half.
