STOCK MARKET SHOWS STRONG

FULL COMPETITION IN ALL CLASSES AND GRADES.

Receipts Are Good and Advance Is Shown In the Price of Swine at Portland Yards.

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 30.—(Special.)—With approximately 2000 head of cattle on the market at North Portland today, trading is showing good life and all classes and grades are receiving the fullest competition. It is the general opinion that the cattle market has encountered the worst of this season's vicissitudes.

Prime Steers, \$12-\$12.50; good to choice steers, \$11-\$12; medium to good steers, \$9.75-\$11; fair to medium, \$8.25-\$9.25; common to fair steers, \$6.00-\$8.00; choice cows and heifers, \$8.00-\$8.50; medium to good cows and heifers, \$6.00-\$7.25; fair to medium, \$5.00-\$6.00; canners, \$3.00-\$4.00; bulls, \$5.00-\$7.50; calves \$9.00-\$12.00; stockers and feeders, \$6.00-\$8.00.

There was approximately 2000 hogs received in the hog alleys overnight. The run is mostly prime, well finished stuff, and the market is strong to a quarter higher. Quotations are: Prime mixed \$17.10-\$17.30; medium mixed, \$16.85-\$17.00; rough heavies, \$15.00-\$15.30; pigs, \$14.00-\$15.00; bulk, \$17.10-\$17.20.

With a small run of sheep and lambs over Sunday the market is steady, with prices unchanged. Prime lambs, \$11.00-\$12.00; fair to medium lambs, \$8.00-\$10.00; yearlings, \$10.00-\$11.00; wethers, \$9.00-\$10.00; ewes \$6.00-\$8.50.

TWO MILES A MINUTE.

Record Flight Is Made By De Havilland Battle Plane.

PITTSBURG, Pa., Oct. 30.—Flying at an average speed of more than two miles a minute, James M. Schoonmaker, jr., son of the vice president of the Pittsburgh and Lake Erie railroad, covered the distance of 228 miles from the Wright flying field at Dayton, O., to Pittsburgh in one hour and forty-five minutes. Schoonmaker was piloted by Howard Rinehart. The flight which was made in a De Havilland Four battle plane, is believed to be a record.

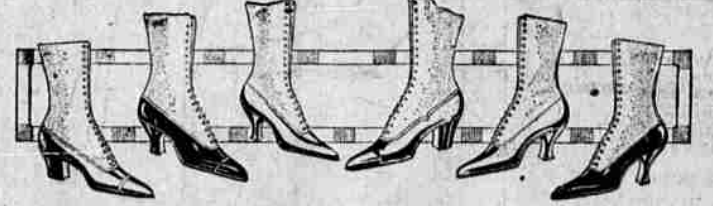
