CONFLICT OVER CLOSING STAND

(Continued from Page 1.)

Mr. Holmes, who was at once appealed to, stated that no Federal order enforcing the closing of garages within the hours specified had, to his knowledge, been issued. In fact the Federal Administration left the entire matter to the discretion of the state administrator.

District Administrator Sanctions.
Through the state council of defense, D. M. Fulson, fuel administrator over the states of California, Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Utah and Montana has sanctioned the request which originates with the Union, Standard and other large companies that filling stations be operated only during regular business hours. Thus state administrators are left to decide between the conflicting orders of the Federal and District Administrators.

For Community's Interests.
In investigating the claims of the opposing parties in the state, Mrs. Holmes states as follows:

The oil distributors base their request on the claim that a conservation of man power is effected by allowing operation by retail distributors only during the regular business hours. While this may in a few instances be true in larger cities, yet in general I believe that it is not. For instance, the class of labor employed in garages, would in such war industries as ship building be unskilled and classed as common labor, which is being turned off by the companies at the rate of several hundred. Of course the larger distributors would find that the salaries of perhaps 25 or 30 employes would be saved by such a plan, without injuring their

interests if other concerns could be forced into like measures. "In country districts, I find that this claim is practically groundless. Most small garages and stations are operated by the proprietors themselves and furthermore a large part of their car storage profits would be lost if early closing hours were ordered.

"I am sincerely anxious to represent the interests of the people of the state. I want to cooperate with the government in every war measure that is necessary but I do not wish to interfere with a man's personal business to the extent in which the order through the state council of defense seems to necessitate. It has been emphasized however, by both the Federal Administrator and the Pacific Coast Oil Company that this closing hour regulation has only been a request on the part of oil companies. It remains to be seen whether, District Administrator Fulson will comply with the orders from Washington as they now stand or whether some other decision will be arrived at."

The statement issued by Federal Administrator Requa, in regard to the controversy under date of August 1 is as follows:

"The attention of the War Industries Board and of the United States Fuel Administration has been called to the wide prevalence throughout the United States of a mistaken impression that some order or recommendation has been issued from Washington with respect to the sale of oil and gasoline. In some places, local automobile dealers' associations have even issued circulars laying down the rule that dealers in oil and gasoline must make no sale of these products on Sundays and holidays or after 6 p. m. on other days, and stating 'It is now an order from Washington.'"

"No such order or recommend-

ation has been issued by any governmental authority or with any governmental approval. The fuel administration has urged that wasteful practices in the use of oil and gasoline shall be stopped and all reasonable and proper measures of conservation shall be observed. No limitations, however, have been placed upon the sale of these products.

"It is not intended to interfere in any way with the activities of automobile dealers' associations or others who, after consideration of the local conditions, may seek to bring about some limitation upon the hours during which oil and gasoline shall be sold to the public; but it is desired that no orders or recommendations have been issued by any governmental authority upon this subject."
