RAILROAD MEN IN POLITICS

ligions and eleemosynary institutions are not construed as political offices.

7. In all cases where railroad officers, attorneys and employees were elected to political offices prior to the issuance of General Order No. 42, August 31, 1918, they will be permitted to complete their terms of office so long as it does not interfere with the performance of their railroad duties. After the completion of said terms of office, they will be governed by the provisions of this order.

8. In all cases where railroad officers, attorneys and employees were nominated for political offices and had become candidates therefor prior to the issuance of General Order No. 42, August 31, 1918, they will be permitted to hold and complete the terms of office to which they may be elected at the general election to be held November, 1918, to the extent that the holding of such offices shall not interfere with the performance of their railroad duties. After the completion of such terms of office,

they shall be governed by the provisions of this order.

Railroad men have given proof of their loyalty to their government. I am confident that they will gladly and patriotically accept now those reasonable governmental regulations concerning political activity which their welfare and America's cause demand. They are the same regulations in their general scope and applications as all other government employees have lived under for many years without the loss of any essential rights and with added dignity to their citizenship.
