### PIONEER ANSWERS DEATH SUMMONS

T. N. ESTES, LONG OF WALLOWA COUNTY, SUCCUMBS TO HEART FAILURE.

T. N. Estes, pioneer of Wallowa county and highly respected citizen of Joseph, passed away last Saturday night at his home in the north end

of town. The immediate cause of his sudden demise was heart failure, but the long sickness which Mr. Estes endured, recently, was the primary cause of his death, which shocked the whole community.

Because of the ban on public gatherings, a private funeral was held Sunday afternoon at the residence of the deceased, which was attended by relatives and immediate friends. Interment took place in the Prairie Creek cemetery, Rev. R. L. Dunn, of Enterprise, officiating.

Thomas Newton Estes was born in Fulton county, Arkansas, on December 5, 1846. On April 24, 1870, he was united in marriage to Julia Anna Tucker. In 1878 he and his wife, in company with a group of other hardy pioneers, crossed the plains and finally settled on a homestead on Prairie Creek, where they lived with their family until the year 1914, at which time he retired and moved to Joseph. He died on November 1, 1918, at the age of 71 years, 10 months and 26 days.

The deceased is survived by his wife and nine children, namely, Jas. Estes, of Inmaha, Mrs. Bert Cole, William Estes, Mrs. Robert Scott, Mrs. O. Hepburn, Oscar Estes, Mrs.

Henry Christy and Hugh Estes, all of Joseph, and Mrs. Fred German, of Michigan.

### EMPLOYEES TREATED

Grande Ronde Lumber Camp at Elgin Moved Up River.

PERRY, Nov. 3.—(Special)—Dr. Bacon accompanied by two of the hospital nurses came to Perry Monday night and vaccinated seventy-two of the employees of the Grande Ronde Lumber Co. The epidemic is spreading in Perry as several new cases have been reported. How ever no serious cases have developed as yet. The public schools are still closed here.

"I had a close shave I guess. Have been in the hospital for 23 days, which is peculiar as I was in ward 23, and bunk 23, also, so I guess the old skiddoo number is lucky for me. As many as three a day died around me in my ward, while I was there. That Spanish influenza is sure a bad one."

"Glad to say I am back to my company quarters again and while I feel fine and am everything in sight, I am very weak, lost fifteen pounds while in the hospital. I don't know just what my status is going to be with the company as I have lost three weeks and am now confined to quarters for fifteen days to recuperate. So I may be put back in another company. If so, it will take me a couple of months longer to get my leather leggings."

"I have not seen Lot since he came, but am trying to locate him; also understand Floyd Charbeneau is here."

"Well, I like the game fine; only wish I was in France doing my bit with the rest of the boys. Of course it is a hard game, but the Hunns must be crushed and the boys that get in the game are going to have the name when the game is won. Remember me to all my friends in La Grande and best personal regards," etc.
