Instructions to Local Campaign Managers and all Team Captains and Workers

The drive will commence Monday, November 11, and will continue for one week. We want to raise for our "Union County War Chest" in this drive, the sum of \$95,634.00.

The amount to be raised, as arrived at by the Union County War Advisory Board, is 10 per cent of card ratings. This amount will take care of all WAR ACTIVITIES DEMANDS for the coming year and that it will not be necessary to have any more drives for war purposes until this fund is exhausted.

Owing to the epidemic of Spanish Influenza which is prevalent at this time, we are unable to have any public meetings and will have to depend on the newspapers and the team workers to spread the gospel of the War Chest to the people.

Local Campaign Managers are to appoint the Team Captains in their district and by all working unitedly in the cause, we will be "doing our bit" and "keep Union County in a class by itself" for doing things in a prompt and business-like manner.

The local Campaign Manager of the War Chest in each district will deposit all money received by him in the bank or banks, in or adjacent to his district, subject to the order of F. S. Slater, Treasurer, Union County War Chest. Then as calls are made, this money will be drawn out of the banks in proportion to the quota allotted from each district.
