

ARMISTICE TERMS MADE KNOWN

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11.--The state department announced at 2:35 o'clock this morning that Germany had signed the armistice at 5 o'clock, French time.

FIGHTING HAS CEASED

Fighting ceased at Eleven o'clock, French time, this morning and at 3:00 o'clock this morning by Oregon time.

New Government

COPENHAGEN, Nov. 11.--The text of the statement issued by the new people's government in Berlin follows:

"In the course of the forenoon of Saturday the formation of a new German people's government was initiated. The greater part of the Berlin garrison and other troops stationed there temporarily went over to the new government.

"The leaders of the deputations of the Social Democratic party declared that they would not shoot against the people. They said they would, in accord with the people's government, intercede in favor of the maintenance of order. Thereupon, in the offices and public buildings the guards which had been stationed there were withdrawn.

"The business of the imperial chancellor is being carried on by the Social Democratic deputy, Herr Ebert.

"It is presumed that apart from the representatives of the recent majority group three independent Social Democrats will enter the future government."

ENDORSES USE OF SERUM

Use of Serum Should be Limited
Is Advice of Portland Bacteriological Office--Serum Does Not Kill Bacteria.

That condemnation of the influenza vaccine as useless and ineffectual is unpremeditated and not based on the wide experience of hospitals and physicians, is the statement made today by Dr. A. L. Richardson, city health officer. Dr. Richardson states that his experience with this remedy which has been heartily endorsed by the State Board of Health has been altogether satisfactory.

Influenza Ban Raised Next Week
Should conditions continue favorable as they are at present the ban against all public meetings will be raised next week.

Dr. Richardson's statement is as follows: "Conditions have so improved that, barring any unexpected spread of the disease, which I do not at all anticipate, this will be the last week of the closed program. The epidemic here is under control, no new cases having been reported to my office either yesterday or today.

Vaccine Condemned Too Hastily
"I feel that the influenza vaccine should not have been condemned so hastily. My experience with it has been very satisfactory. That a few cases have developed after

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WASHINGTON, NOV. 11.--(BY UNITED PRESS.)--PRESIDENT WILSON THIS AFTERNOON TOLD CONGRESS AND THE WORLD THE TERMS WHICH GERMANY ACCEPTED WITH THE SIGNING OF THE ARMISTICE. THE TERMS PICTURED GERMANY SURRENDERING ABJECTLY TO MARSHAL FOCH IN THE FIELD; HER ARMIES BEATEN; HER GOVERNMENT OVERTHROWN; HER MASTER IN FLIGHT. THERE WAS A SMALL ATTENDANCE AT CONGRESS, AND A SMALL CROWD WHO HEARD THE PRESIDENT'S BURNING WORDS, BUT ENTHUSIASM RAN RIOT.

TERMS OF THE ARMISTICE

The armistice terms include the evacuation of all invaded territory of the allies, including Alsace-Lorraine and Luxemburg.

Surrender of a vast amount of guns and equipment.

Evacuation of the left bank of the Rhine.

Unconditional surrender of all German forces in East Africa.

Reparation for all damage done.

Surrender of scores of submarines and battleships.

Concentration of aircraft at stipulated points.

Reparation for all allied and United States merchant vessels.

Abandonment of Bucharest, the capital of Roumania.

The duration of the armistice is thirty days.

MUST ABANDON TREATIES.

Abandonment is required of the Bucharest and Brest treaties and the evacuation of all the Black sea ports.

FOURTEEN DAYS TO LEAVE.

The abandonment of Alsace-Lorraine, Luxemburg and all the occupied territory must be completed within fourteen days. The occupation by the allies and the United States forces, jointly, will keep pace with the evacuation.

REPATRIATION IS REQUIRED.

All the inhabitants of the occupied territories must be repatriated within fourteen days.

SURRENDER OF MUNITIONS.

The German army must surrender in good condition, 5000 guns, heavy and field pieces, 30,000 machine guns, 3000 minewerfers and 2000 airplanes.

TO RELINQUISH RHINE.

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CASUALTIES OF U. S.

Total of 12,460 Were Killed in Action in the War.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11.--(United Press.)--America's casualties in the great world conflict totalled 69,620, of which number 12,460 were killed in action, it is announced.

CROWN PRINCE HELD

LONDON, Nov. 11.--(By United Press.)--Central News dispatches from Ribben say that Germany's former crown prince is held at the Dutch border by guards. Hindenburg did not accompany the kaiser.

The kaiser is in Holland and is now awaiting the decision of the Dutch government regarding his remaining there.

BRITISH TOOK MONS

Historic Point In Early War Days Was Captured.

LONDON, Nov. 11.--(By United Press.)--Haig has announced that the British captured Mons, the Belgian city made famous by the British defense in the war's early days.

NO MORE OVERTIME.

Rush Is Over In Government Operated Plants.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11.--(United Press.)--Orders have been issued to eliminate all Sunday and overtime work in government construction, in government owned or controlled plants producing war supplies.

German Autocracy Overthrown

Preceding the signing of the armistice, the autocracy of Germany definitely passed out of existence and the rule of the people is in full sway.

On Sunday, Berlin, the German capital, following many of the principal cities of Germany joined the ranks of the revolutionists.

A Copenhagen dispatch of Sunday announces that Frederick Ebert, Socialist, has become the German chancellor, succeeding Maximilian.

The Wolff bureau, the semi-official news agency of Germany, states that this action was for the purpose of assuring assistance in the solution of the demobilizing problems.

A proclamation of the new chancellor announces that plans will be made for the formation of a people's government.

REVOLUTIONISTS HOLD OFFICIAL POWER.

The revolution, which has been under way for several days, reached absolute control Sunday. All railway stations are occupied by the Soldiers' council. It is announced that the great Krupp gun works at Essen have been seized by the revolutionists.

The leader of the Socialists in the reichstag announced: "The kaiser and the crown prince have abdicated. The dynasty has been overthrown. It is a splendid victory for the German people.

"Herr Ebert has been charged with the formation of a new government, in which all shades of the Social Democratic party are to participate.

"Only decrees from the government bearing the signature of Herr Ebert have validity. Only orders from the minister for war bearing the counter-signature of the Social Democrat, acting as assistant, are official."

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
