PLAN TO EXTEND THE AMERICAN SPIRIT.

Only Chairmen of State Council of Defense Receive Notification

The following circular has been addressed to the county chairmen of the state council of defense:

A nation declares itself by the manner in which it celebrates its holidays. If foreign-born people share and help to shape celebrations of American holidays, they will understand more quickly and more sympathetically the meaning of the American spirit. In the last analysis, all American agencies are only tending that fire and trying to bring within its heat those they would make into Americans. The American spirit says that all men are comrades. If we are going to work in its name, we must say so too—and believe it—and live it.

Thanksgiving day is the least public, the most personal, the quietest of our holidays. As a rule, each of us invites only his friends to share in its celebration, which is a part of his life at home. But it is distinctively and solely American, and it offers, perhaps, a better opportunity than our more brilliant festivals for the play of that citizenship which is at the very root of true Americanism.

If on Thanksgiving day each of us should invite to his table some one, not yet familiar with American ways, and do his part, simply and unobtrusively, without taint of patronage or condescension, in making clear the meaning of the day and the meaning of America. November twenty-eighth would see us a step farther on the way to a solidly American nation. The President and the Governors will in due time issue their usual formal proclamations, let us give them life by many little obscure responses from our hearts.
