

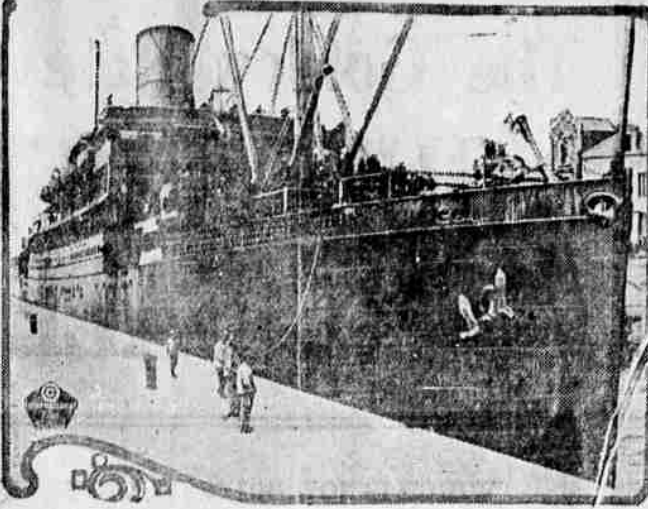
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SOME OF THE SECOND MILLION YANKS

The Call Now Is to Duty.

More regrettable, in the estimation of the Democratic New York World, than any political changes that have taken place is the spirit of partisanship which has been awakened, and for this the President cannot be held blameless. The World said at the time, and it says now, that his interference with the nomination and election of members of Congress in various states was unwise and calculated to defeat the very purpose that he wished to promote. Americans have always responded to true White House leadership, but they have just as consistently resented White House intrusion upon their local affairs. There never should be a repetition of this error.

As we can imagine nothing worse for the country in its present situation than a continuation of the venomous partisanship recently in evidence, we must entreat Democrats as well as Republicans to remember that the interests at stake transcend in importance the welfare of any political organization or the future of any politician. The call today is to duty. Those who give closest heed to that summons will have the fewest reasons for regret and apology hereafter.

To all such we commend this passage from a short speech by Abraham Lincoln a few days after the Presidential contest in 1864:

"The strife of this election is but human nature practically applied to the facts of the case. What has occurred in this case must ever recur in similar cases. Human nature will not change. In any future great national trial, compared with the men of this we shall have as weak as strong, as silly and as wise, as bad and as good. Let us therefore study the incidents of this as philosophy to learn wisdom from, and none of them as wrongs to be avenged."

If it is human nature, irritable on provocation, to go to extremes of passion and excitement, so it is human nature, on returning soberly to reason, to correct its errors and reject evil counsels. With unlimited faith in the patriotism and good sense of the American people, without regard to party, we look for a truce at Washington that will last at least until peace has been established abroad.

Compensation Plan Replaces Pensions.

Modern substitutes for pensions have been provided by the government for injured soldiers or for the dependents of soldiers killed in the service. The Injury Division of the Information and Education Service, Department of Labor, is collecting information for soldiers and their relatives in regard to the provision that will be made for them.

The United States provides compensation to injured soldiers or to the dependents of soldiers who are killed, in addition to all allotments, family allowances, and war-risk insurance. This compensation is entirely distinct from government insurance protection, and applies to officers and men alike, without regard to rank or pay. It applies to total or partial disability and to death incurred in the line of duty.

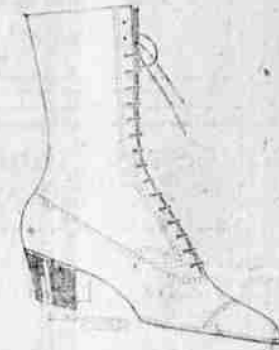
