

WEEKLY REPORT OF THE CITY MANAGER

To the Hon. Commission, City of La Grande. Gentlemen: I herewith submit my report for the week ending November 20, 1918.

The chief of the fire department reports two alarms for the week ending November 17. The one on November 11, was a false alarm sent in from Box 26. This was the night of the celebration and was undoubtedly the result of someone who wished to see the department turn out.

The chief of police reports five arrests for the week. Drunks, two; having liquor in their possession, one; traffic violations, two; amount of

fines and forfeitures, \$48.50; number of stock impounded, one; pound fees, \$3.50.

The street and water department expended for labor for the week, \$117.50, of which \$42.50 is charged to the water department and \$75 to the street department. Fire street has been regraded, fire hydrants have been inspected, several rather serious leaks repaired several crosswalks repaired and some sidewalks repaired, the flush tank cleaned and sewers inspected.
