## TO HAVE CLASS IN ENGLISH

PROPOSED BRANCH AT THE  
Y. M. C. A. NIGHT SCHOOL.

All Will Depend on the Number  
Who Desire Benefit of Such  
Course.

Some men of foreign birth have made inquiry about a class in English for foreigners in the Y. M. C. A. night school and if enough men want such a class one will be formed. Men speaking any foreign language can enter these classes and learn to read, write and speak English or men who have some knowledge of the English language can greatly improve their working knowledge of the language.

Two or three young men have asked for a class in public speaking and some inquiry has been made about classes in bookkeeping and shorthand. Classes will be formed in any or all of these subjects when enough students can be found to make a class worth while. The policy of the Y. M. C. A.
