MISPLACED SYMPATHY

To the Editor:

Now that the world war is over the thinking people of all nations are wondering what has been and what will be accomplished for humanity. We have broken down the greatest military machine the world has ever known; we have shown that might was not right and we have demonstrated to posterity that from now on the world must be ruled by the people.

It has been said by many men of influence that this will be the last war; that wars cannot happen in the future. In order for this to come about it will be necessary for the whole policy of the human race through its governmental agencies to be absolutely right-about-face. The following changes must of necessity take place:

1. There must be a Union of Nations; not a mere "league of nations," but the nations of the world must be bound into one "inseparable union," the same as these glorious United States of ours. There must be one single governmental agency, deriving its just powers from the consent of the governed. This government of the world will be formed as follows:

The United Nations of the World
The United Nations of the World shall be composed of all the separate nations now in existence. The legislative body of said Union shall be vested in a Congress of the world. The Congress shall be composed of ONE and only one delegate from each nation. The Congress of world shall begin session nine months out of the year; the other three months to be used for vacation. The seat of government shall be at the Capital of the World, very likely The Hague.

There will be a Supreme Court of the World. This court shall be composed of a judge selected from each nation and the court shall sit one-third at a time while the other two-thirds go back to the people. If a dispute comes up between England and Spain for instance each nation will send its counsel, witnesses will be subpoenaed and the Supreme Court of the World will decide the case.

Of course the court would be a nullity if it did not have proper authority behind it to carry out its mandates. Therefore, we must have our executive branch of the government. This will be composed of the armies of the world, but it will be all one army. Each nation will send say 10,000 soldiers, and 10,000 sailors. These soldiers and sailors to be the World Army and World Navy for the purpose of policing the world. The small state (nation) will send the identical number of soldiers and sailors that the large nation will. But the strong nation will put up more expense in exact proportion to the number of people she has within her borders, so that the small state will share a small expense and the large state the large expense.

No nation of itself will be allowed to raise armies. No nation of itself will be allowed to manufacture munitions. No nation of itself will be allowed to "prepare." These will be powers delegated to the Congress of the World. Then you see each nation has but one vote and one nation has as much say as another; the small as much as the great. And is that not what we fought for? We fought to sustain the principle that the small nation's rights are as sacred as the great nation's.
