WAS PIONEER OF 'IS

Late Joseph Lineberger Very Early Arrival in Oregon.

The late Joseph Lineberger, whose funeral was held yesterday afternoon, was among the very earliest arrivals in Oregon, having reached the Willamette valley in 1843, being at that time but four years of age. He was born in Missouri December 22, 1839, and was 79 years, eleven months and two days old at the time of his death Nov. 24, at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Walter L. Lane.

Mr. Lineberger came to Grande Ronde valley in 1887 and took up a homestead in Ladd Canyon where he made his home for 27 years on what was known as Ladd Canyon Park. He leaves to mourn his loss a wife, three daughters, son

and stepson and has two sons dead. Those living are: Mrs. Minnie Lowman, North Bend, Ore.; Ralph L. Lineberger, Spokane, Wash.; Mrs. Helen Lane, La Grande; Miss Christine Lineberger, La Grande; L. W. Dromsault, La Grande and a sister, Mrs. Delilah Adams of Junction City, Oregon.
