PARIS, Nov. 18. (By Mail)—You have all heard of turning green with envy and black with rage or blue with excitement. Here in Paris, however, the dear girls are turning all sorts of nice, tasty pastel shades much more simply without any undue tax on the emotions. To be sure, there is a tax of a sort involved, but it's only a 10 per cent duty of all face powder and no one is going to let a little thing like that stand in the way of a perfectly sweet mauve complexion.

When I first passed the windows of the divers perfume and powder shops, and nowhere in the world are they so fascinating as they are in Paris, I was struck by the display of powder-like substances in shallow dishes, in shades of copper, orange, yellow, pink, flesh, cream, salmon, deep rose, delicate mauve and pale Nile green. I thought of course it must be a side line of those tasty, hasty, powdered gelatin desserts for the tired business man that he won't touch after you make 'em. Of course the more trying shades of ashen green and a little dash of mauve are for evening wear and artificial light. Just between you and me, I'm really dying to try the effect of a little Nile green on myself, and of course I will be dying if I do.

It would seem to be the acid test of devotion to have to kiss an upturned yellow face "Goodbye" in the morning and the same are all done over by a pale mauve "Hello" at night.
