### BUY HAY IN IDAHO

Two or Three Dollars per Ton is Paid for Alfalfa.

The Elgin Courier states that J. N. Chandler and H. Sommer returned the latter part of last week from a trip to Weiser and Payette in Idaho, where they went for the purpose of purchasing hay for shipment here to insure plenty of feed for their cattle during the winter. They first visited Weiser, but in finding what they wanted there, went on to Payette, where they secured four loads of first crop alfalfa, paying \$21 per ton. They state that they might have obtained hay at a figure under \$21 had they been desirous of spending several days there. By the time the hay is shipped here and delivered to their farms the cost per ton will approximate \$27.

T. H. Morelock of Joseph was in Idaho at the same time for the purpose of purchasing a considerable quantity of hay, but had made no purchase at the time Chandler and Sommer left for home.

### IN FAR-OFF SAMOA

Mrs. Forrest Ivanhoe Appeared in Red Cross Concert

From the Samoa Times, a newspaper published in Apia, British Samoa, and recently forwarded to Mrs. A. E. Ivanhoe, a very lengthy description of an American Red Cross concert is given and a very splendid tribute paid Mrs. Forrest Ivanhoe as follows:

"One hardly knows which to admire most in referring to Mrs. Ivanhoe's contributions to the entertainment, her vivacity and charm of manner or the rich quality and extraordinary flexibility of her voice. Taken together her attributes as a vocalist must be regarded as entirely irresistible. Her first effort, a French song with violin obligato, by Bandmaster Miller, received a very sympathetic rendition; and then by way of contrast she gave "Over There," in which she had the able assistance of Chief Yeoman, W. D. Welsh, a singer with a rousing voice and apparently unlimited energy in his exercise. The reputation of "Over There" had already reached us, from over there in Tutuila. It has no literary pretensions but when sung in the familiar style of Mrs. Ivanhoe and W. D. Welsh it became a veritable tour de force.

"Another song by Mrs. Ivanhoe, 'The Dainty Damsel,' very artistically rendered and evincing remarkable flexibility of vocal power was perhaps the choicest item of the evening. It was followed by 'Joan of Arc,' a popular American war song introducing the first few bars of 'The Marseillaise' and a catchy tuneless piece in which Mrs. Ivanhoe was assisted by W. D. Welsh, the vivacious rendering by these two capable artists being received with a perfect

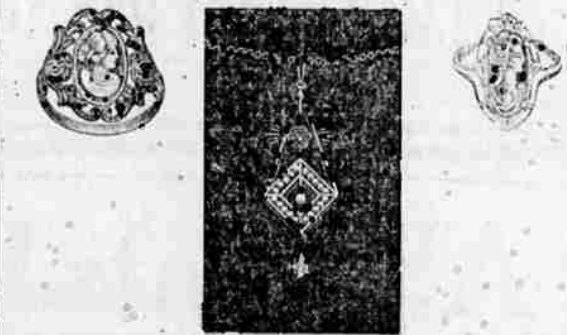
