ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

In the matter of the guardianship of Ivan D. Baker, Zona Baker, Margaret Baker and George Zeigler Baker, minors.

Now at this time this matter came on to be heard upon the verified petition of Laura E. Woodcock, the duly appointed, qualified and acting guardian of the estate and persons of the above-named minors, for an order of this court directing and authorizing her to sell the real property belonging to said minors, and it appearing to the court from said petition that said minors are the owners of the following real estate, to-wit:

North half of Lot 2, block 1, in Island City, Union county, Oregon; also a tract of land commencing at the SW corner of the SW 1/4 of Section 31, Township 1 South, Range 29 E. W. M., in Union county, Oregon, running thence east, 160 rods, more or less, to the SE corner of the SW 1/4, same section, thence north 42 rods, thence west 160 rods to Township line, thence South 42 rods to the place of beginning.
