VOLCANO KALAEUA NORMAL.
HILO, Hawaii, T. H., Dec. 26.—The volcano of Kalaeua has returned to its normal state following unusual activity which continued for several weeks, and during which thousands of tons of lava were forced through the cracks in the floor of the old crater which surrounds the boiling fire lake. The central lava pit has descended to a depth of 100 feet. Another spectacular display in 1920 is forecast by scientists of the volcano observatory.

DRIVE TO BE STARTED SOON TO AID INSTITUTION.

Money Wanted for Purely Home Purpose.—Work should not be handicapped.

When a people have a meritorious institution, they soon begin to lack appreciation of it, but this is only human, and it is also true that it feeds but a little bit of stimulus to get full appreciation of such a fact pulsating through the veins of the public at large once more. A. exchequer was forgotten during the streets of the war but now it cries for help, and to help it becomes the duty of every property owner and every resident of La Grande. BERLIN IS IN BAD SHAPE

LONDON, Dec. 27.—(United Press)—Mutinous sailors seized rifles and joined in the defense of the royal palace against the Loyal Guard, according to dispatches filed in Berlin Wednesday night and received by the London Express today. The sailors also agreed to a surrender, but refused to leave the city. They announced they would continue to support Chancellor Ebert. The city is on the verge of anarchy and fighting is expected to continue, the dispatch stated.

JUDGES ARE ELECTED

PARIS, Dec. 27.—(United Press)—The Bolsheviks have occupied the courts in Essen, ejecting all judges, according to a Zurich dispatch received by the Paris Journal. The German press, said the dispatch, is becoming very pessimistic over the new revolt.

DR. SOLF WAVES ALARM SIGNAL

ALLIED COUNTRIES ARE ALSO IN DANGER, HE SAYS.

Says Bolshevism Is the Enemy of the Entire World Today—Would Suppress It.

BERLIN, Dec. 27.—(United Press)—The alliance between Germany and the allies to defeat Bolshevism proposed by Dr. Solf, former German foreign secretary, is considered necessary. In an interview with Dr. Solf he declares that the spread of Bolshevism is the greatest menace in the world today, and that the victorious allied countries are in as much danger from its influence as are Germany and Russia.

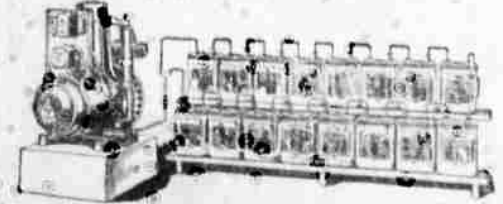
