Why Meat Prices Vary in Different Stores

Prime steers.....	\$12.00-12.50
Good to choice steers.....	11.00-11.50
Common to medium steers.....	10.00-10.50
Yearlings, fair to fancy.....	9.00-9.50
Fat cows and heifers.....	8.00-8.50
Canning cows and heifers.....	7.00-7.50
Hills, plain to best.....	6.00-6.50
Tope to fancy calves.....	5.00-5.50
Western range steers.....	10.00-10.50

These newspaper quotations represent live cattle prices in Chicago on December 30th, 1918.

The list shows price ranges on nine general classified groups with a spread of \$13.85 per cwt.—the lowest at \$6.50 and the highest at \$20.35.

Why this variation in price?

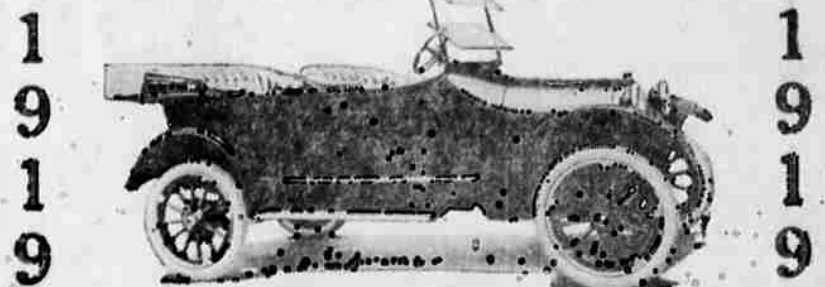
