ARMY TESTS PROVES SANITY

NEW YORK, Jan. 17.—That a young man who passes the tests for enlistment in the Canadian army is competent enough to inherit \$60,000, is contended by counsel for Russell B. L. DeGard. His sister, Mrs. Ross Hendrickson, of LaSalleport, Queens, is attacking his right to an equal share of the estate of their mother, which originally \$8000, was increased by their guardian in the last ten years. Under the will the \$8000 was to be equally divided between brother and sister. The guardian was Francis P. Reese, brother of the decedent. When the sister came of age three years ago she received her half, increased to \$60,000. The boy became of age about a year ago, and while visiting his uncle on his ranch in Alberta enlisted in the Canadian forces.
