## The Greatest Tragedy of The Great War

**A PROCLAMATION**  
For more than three years American philanthropy has been a large factor in keeping alive Armenian, Syrian, Greek and other exiles and refugees of western Asia.

On two former occasions I have appealed to the American people in behalf of these homeless sufferers whom the vicissitudes of war and massacres had brought to the extreme need.

The response has been most generous, but now the period of rehabilitation is at hand. Vastly larger sums will be required to restore these once prosperous, but now impoverished, refugees to their former homes than were required merely to sustain life in their desert exile.

It is estimated that about 4,000,000 Armenian, Syrian, Greek and other war sufferers in the near east will require outside help to sustain them through the winter. Many of them are now hundreds of miles from their home land. The vast majority of them are helpless, women and children, including 400,000 orphans.

The American committee for relief in the near east is appealing for a minimum of \$30,000,000 to be subscribed Jan. 12-19, 1919, with which to meet the most urgent needs of these people.

I, therefore, again call upon the people of the United States to make even more generous contributions than they have made heretofore to sustain during the winter months those, who, through no fault of their own, have been left in a starving, shelterless condition, and to help re-establish these ancient and solely oppressed people in their former homes on a self-supporting basis.

W. F. Landrum, who is leader of the Sunday school campaign in Union

county, has just handed to the Evening Observer the above proclamation by President Wilson. Mr. Landrum says that word just received from New York indicates that the end of the war has greatly increased our responsibility. Three million sufferers and refugees have been made accessible by the signing of the armistice who could not be reached during the war. Now our task is not only relief, but to help restore the refugees to their homes and provide the equipment that will enable them to become self-supporting.

The Sunday schools of No. 1 American have been called to give \$2,000,000 to this cause. Thirty millions will be immediately needed. Mr. Landrum says that the Sunday schools of Union county are responding most heartily to the call, and their offerings are expected to be both large and generous.

Four hundred thousand of the sufferers are orphans. Sixty dollars will clothe and feed one of these orphans for a whole year. Many Sunday school classes are assuming the support of an orphan by paying \$5.00 per month for one year. We are sure the Sunday schools of our county will be found in the vanguard of the American Sunday school army in this worthy campaign.

## HUNTER WILL START FOX FARM

ELGIN TRAPPER CATCHES PAIR OF BEAUTIES UNINJURED

Animals Are Said to Be the First of the Kind Taken Alive in the Elgin District.

ELGIN, Jan. 28.—Jep Christiansen, well known local hunter and trapper, who cannot resist the call of the ever-green pines and the lore of the primeval forest, came to town a few days ago in proud possession of a red fox, which is valued at no small sum of money. It has a beautiful coat of red fur and while on exhibition in the window of Hallgarth's hardware store attracted the attention of many admiring eyes. Nor is that all. He trapped a black fox about three weeks ago, which carries a beautiful covering of black, and is of opposite sex to the red fox. The black fox was caught in a trap on what Christiansen calls the divide between Salmon and Walla Walla rivers, about thirty miles north of Elgin. The red fox was captured in the same trap and in the same location, which indicates that the two were paired. Neither of them were hurt in the trap. **BOIL DRINKING WATER**
