GALLAGHER RESOLUTION WILL BE DISCUSSED TOMORROW

WASHINGTON, Jan. 31.—The Gallagher resolution calling upon American peace commissioners to urge the freedom, independence and self-determination of Ireland at the Paris conference, will be acted on by the house foreign relations committee Saturday morning, Chairman Flood announced Thursday. They decided to act on the resolution sponsored by Representative Gallagher of Illinois instead of the one by Representative McLaughlin of Pennsylvania, president of the Ancient Order of Hibernians, which requested congress to use its offices to secure a government for Ireland like that of Canada.

NEW OWNER OF THE BOSTON BRAVES GREAT BASEBALL FAN

NEW YORK, Jan. 31.—George W. Grant, the new owner of the Boston Nationals, is a veteran baseball fan and a great friend of Vice President John J. McGraw of the Giants. He has been prominent in the motion picture business both here and in London for several years.

RADEK IS REPORTED READY TO REVOLT AGAIN

LONDON, Jan. 31.—Karl Radek, the Russian radical, is organizing another revolution, according to dispatches from Berlin. Radek fled from Berlin immediately after the assassination of Rosa Luxemburg and Karl Liebknecht. Later advices from Berlin reported that he had returned to that city in disguise.
