American Ex-President Strongly Endorses Near East Relief.

William Howard Taft strongly endorses the nation-wide drive of the American Committee for Relief in the Near East to raise \$30,000,000 for the immediate relief and rehabilitation of the Armenians and other destitute and starving peoples of Western Asia.

"The history of the Armenian people is too dreadful to rehearse. In one of the deportations, one group was turned into the desert of Mesopotamia and the other group into the desert of Syria. On the march they suffered untold tortures and thousands of them died from starvation and the cruelties perpetrated on them by the Turks. Those now remaining are in the direst necessity possible."

"The American Committee for Armenian and Syrian Relief, one of the most efficient of the war, is now appealing to you for funds. The government is planning to give aid to the starving people of Europe, but these people are in Asia beyond government aid and what the government can do needs supplementing from philanthropy. The government relief measures will require a little time to work out and in the interim philanthropy will be called upon to give aid to the starving people. And government organization could not properly take care of the relief for the Armenians and Syrians. The organization with the most elasticity is necessary in this case to render the fullest aid. This the American Committee for Armenian and Syrian Relief is prepared to do."

"The American people may be sure that the money contributed to the relief campaign will be used to the best advantage personally. Knowing the personnel of the committee and its work as well as I do, I appeal to not only you but to all the people in the world to help in this cause which means the salvation of the lives of a people that are worthy of our best aid."
