People have quit since the war ended, not realizing that America has a great debt to humanity left on us. The interest has lagged because the last man has been fired, but the hungry and starving and naked citizens of Europe still need aid. In order to get a stock of goods for the shop next week has been declared salvage week. Committees of Red Cross ladies will call with a machine at every home and wait until the housewife goes through her home determining what she can spare and the goods will be loaded into the automobile and taken to the shop. It is requested that every lady think over what she can let go in advance and have the goods as nearly ready as possible for every home in La Grande will be visited.

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### WANTS RECRUITS FOR U. S. MARINES

A recruiting office for the United States marine corps has been opened in La Grande today by Sergeant J. E. Brooks of the Marines, who arrived in the city last night from Portland. The new office is in the Summer building, room eleven, where Sergeant Brooks will be glad to see any young men who are interested in getting into this famous branch of the service. Men between the ages of 18 and 35 years are eligible for enlistment, provided they are physically fit.

Sergeant Brooks states that the office will be established here indefinitely. His wife and child have come to La Grande with him and they intend making their home here.

### CROWDER CONFIRMED

WASHINGTON, Feb. 14.—Nomination of Maj. Gen. Enoch Crowder to be judge advocate general of the army for another term of four years was confirmed Thursday night by the senate. The nomination was received during the day and was immediately approved by the senate military committee, which interrupted a public hearing to set General Crowder's present term will expire Saturday.

### FIRST OF THE 1919 MODELS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED.

Outlook for a Big Year in This Line Is Considered to Be Encouragingly Bright.

Motorcycle racing, too, is in for a healthy revival. The factories have plans under way to put on ten big meets during the coming summer, one or more of which will be held on the Pacific coast.

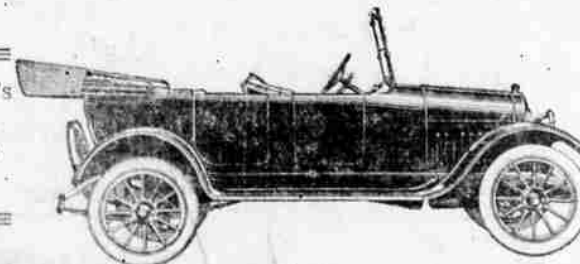
