AT THE LIBRARY

EIGHTH GRADE PUPILS HAVE INTERESTING EXHIBIT.
Good Work of Miss Clark, Art Supervisor in City Schools, Reflected in Work of Scholars.

Between seventy and seventy-five posters designed and drawn by eighth grade pupils in the city schools are on display at the La Grande public library this week, where they are being viewed by many interested parents and friends. The exhibit was planned and arranged under the direction of Miss Blanch Clark, the art supervisor of La Grande's school, and many excellent specimens of work are shown.

The posters are all of a uniform size, and were prepared from copy given by Miss Clark and Miss Lucia Haley, the librarian. Some of the designs have been very artistically executed, and many striking original ideas have been carried out.

Some of the phrases used were: "If you want a good book, go to the public library;" "Clean hands mean clean books;" "Not open Sunday until September;" "Please watch your own wraps and purse;" "Have you a hobby? Consult the public library;" "The library belongs to you—why don't you use it?" "Let the library help you."

One of the posters that the writer thought particularly good was executed by Russell Price, who attends the Greenwood school. His specimen showed a very striking border, with the wording well disposed of within. Another fine one was drawn by Emerson Schrock, of Central school, and Ruth Keeney and Pearl Keeney, who attend Rivera school, each had their names on excellent examples of work.
